A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the State is facing
2	a severe shortage of healthcare providers. This situation is
3	particularly acute in primary care where most of the prevention,
4	early intervention, and cost savings in healthcare occur.
5	The legislature further finds that the Hawaii health
6	systems corporation primary care training program is an
7	effective way to reduce the impact of the shortage of primary
8	care providers and improve access to healthcare throughout the
9	State. Administered by Hilo medical center in coordination with
10	Hawaii health systems corporation regions, this
11	interdisciplinary program includes the Hawaii island family
12	medicine residency program and training for advanced practice
13	nurses from the school of nursing and dental hygiene at the
14	University of Hawaii at Manoa and the school of nursing at the
15	University of Hawaii at Hilo; clinical pharmacists from the
16	University of Hawaii at Hilo's college of pharmacy; and post-
17	doctoral fellows from I Ola Lahui, an organization that trains
18	psychologists to meet the needs of those living in rural areas.

1	The purpose of this Act is to address the shortage of
2	primary care providers in the State by appropriating funds for
3	the Hawaii health systems corporation primary care training
4	program at the Hilo medical center which will be expanded to
5	neighbor island health facilities. The success of this
6	program's training model will generate interdisciplinary teams
7	capable of caring for four times as many patients as independent
8	practicing physicians. Hawaii will benefit greatly because this
9	program eliminates the need to train or attract unrealistically
10	high numbers of physicians.
11	SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
12	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$2,800,000 or so much
13	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2013-2014 and the
14	same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
15	2014-2015 for the Hawaii health systems corporation primary care
16	training program at the Hilo medical center.
17	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii
18	health systems corporation for the purposes of this Act.
19	SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2013.
