A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE CODE OF ETHICS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Policy makers, state agency leaders, candidates for state elective offices, and members of state boards and 2 commissions are required to file annual financial disclosure 3 statements with the state ethics commission. The financial 4 disclosure statements reveal potential conflicts of interest. 5 6 However, only the financial disclosure statements of the governor, lieutenant governor, legislators, and state department 7 directors and their deputies are public records and available 8 for inspection and duplication. Financial disclosure statements 9 are not publicly available for the majority of the members of 10 very powerful state boards and commissions. These boards and 11 commissions shape the political, economic, social, 12 environmental, and cultural fabric of society in Hawaii. 13 The purpose of this Act is to further ensure transparency 14 and accountability of individuals serving in state government by 15 making the financial disclosure statements of state board and 16
