A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE ENVIRONMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii is the
- 2 largest exporter in the United States of aquatic species that
- 3 are intended for the aquarium trade. Consequently, aquarium
- 4 collectors capture hundreds of thousands of fish and
- 5 invertebrates from Hawaii's reefs every year and over two
- 6 hundred species of fish and invertebrates. Herbivorous fish and
- 7 invertebrates are important to reef health in helping to control
- 8 algae growth, among other things. The legislature further finds
- 9 that diminished stocks of coral reef fish results in a shift
- 10 from coral-dominated to algae-dominated reef ecosystems, which
- 11 impairs the health of the reefs.
- 12 The purpose of this Act is to require that the department
- 13 of land and natural resources conduct an environmental
- 14 assessment for the purpose of issuing permits to take aquatic
- 15 life for aquarium purposes.
- 16 SECTION 2. The department of land and natural resources
- 17 shall conduct an environmental assessment as described in
- 18 chapter 343, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to determine if aquarium 2013-0179 SB SMA.doc

- 1 fish permits should continue to be issued pursuant to section
- 2 188-31, Hawaii Revised Statutes, or limited in number and scope.
- For purposes of this Act, the issuance of aquarium fish
- 4 permits shall be deemed to be a program or project as used in
- 5 the definition of "action" in section 343-2, Hawaii Revised
- 6 Statutes.
- 7 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 8 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 9 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2013-2014 and
- 10 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
- 11 year 2014-2015 for the department of land and natural resources
- 12 to conduct an environmental assessment as described in section 2
- 13 of this Act.
- 14 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 15 of land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act.
- 16 SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 17 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 18 begun before its effective date.

SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2013.
