A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO GAMBLING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that law enforcement has
- 2 often used the nuisance abatement law to hold owners and
- 3 landlords accountable for addressing known criminal activities
- 4 occurring on their real property. However, the nuisance
- 5 abatement law currently does not include gambling offenses even
- 6 though illegal gambling rooms have been the scene of extremely
- 7 violent crimes such as homicides and are known to be used for
- 8 the distribution of narcotics. Currently, there are no
- 9 consequences for property owners who fail to take action to halt
- 10 ongoing gambling activity occurring on their property. The
- 11 nuisance abatement law must therefore be amended to provide an
- 12 additional course of action for law enforcement to address
- 13 illegal gambling activities.
- 14 The purpose of this Act is to enhance the ability of law
- 15 enforcement to create safer communities by including gambling
- 16 offenses in the nuisance abatement law.
- 17 SECTION 2. Section 712-1270, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
