A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FOOD SECURITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that in the event of an
- 2 emergency, catastrophic event, or quarantine where state harbors
- 3 and airports would be closed for an indefinite period of time,
- 4 the issue of food security would become of paramount importance.
- 5 It is imperative that the legislature act now to address food
- 6 security issues stemming from catastrophic events that could
- 7 entirely prevent cargo ships from reaching port or aircraft from
- 8 air dropping supplies, leaving the State completely self-reliant
- 9 to meet the food needs of the people.
- 10 The purpose of this Act is to establish a food security
- 11 task force to develop an emergency food plan for the State that
- 12 addresses certain food security issues resulting from an
- 13 emergency, catastrophic event, or quarantine.
- 14 SECTION 2. (a) There is established in the department of
- 15 agriculture for administrative purposes a temporary food
- 16 security task force.
- 17 (b) The task force shall develop an emergency food plan

- 1 resulting from an emergency, catastrophic event, or quarantine
- 2 that leaves the State completely self-reliant to meet the food
- 3 needs of the people.
- 4 (c) The chairperson of the board of agriculture of the
- 5 State shall serve as chairperson of the task force.
- 6 (d) In addition to the chairperson of the board of
- 7 agriculture, the task force shall consist of the following
- 8 members or their representatives:
- 9 (1) The adjutant general and director of civil defense;
- 10 (2) The chairperson of the board of land and natural
- 11 resources;
- 12 (3) The vice director of civil defense;
- 13 (4) The chairperson of the agribusiness development
- 14 corporation board of directors; and
- 15 (5) The dean and director of the college of tropical
- agriculture and human resources.
- 17 (e) The chairperson of the task force may invite
- 18 representatives from the following stakeholders to participate
- 19 as members:
- 20 (1) The Hawaii Farm Bureau Federation;
- 21 (2) The Hawaii Farmers Union United board of directors;
- 22 (3) The United States military; and

2		chairperson.
3	(f)	The task force shall:
4	(1)	Identify public and private lands that could be
5		cultivated for immediate emergency farming;
6	(2)	Identify irrigation equipment and infrastructure needs
7		for large scale farming;
8	(3)	Identify the best crops to grow in terms of nutrition
9		and harvest cycle;
10	(4)	Identify current agriculture operations or companies
11		that could assist the State in growing the best crops;
12	(5)	Examine the feasibility of creating public orchards on
13		government land or planting five thousand fruit trees
14		in state and city parks within the next five years;
15	(6)	Examine the feasibility of using commercial fishermen
16		to provide food from the sea;
17	(7)	Develop a plan to distribute information and resources
18		for individual home gardens, including emergency seed
19		packets;
20	(8)	Consider deer, boar, and wild goat populations as
21		sources of food for any plan;

1	(9)	Develop a food distribution and conservation plan
2		involving existing retail and wholesale food stores
3		and other food bank operations;
4	(10)	Identify vulnerable populations during a food crisis;
5	(11)	Develop an emergency food drop program that identifies
6		other countries, government agencies, businesses,
7		nonprofits, and others who may participate in
8		emergency food drop efforts; and
9	(12)	Develop a security plan to monitor and protect farms
10		and other food growing areas.
11	(g)	The task force shall submit reports of its findings
12	and recom	mendations, including any proposed legislation, to the
13	legislature as follows:	
14	(1)	An interim report no later than twenty days prior to
15		the convening of the regular session of 2014; and
16	(2)	A final report to the legislature no later than twenty
17		days prior to the convening of the regular session of
18		2015.
19	(h)	The task force shall cease to exist on June 30, 2015.

SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2013. 1
