BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

3	condition" to read as follows:		
4	""Debilitating medical condition" means:		
5	(1)	Canc	er, glaucoma, positive status for human
6		immu	nodeficiency virus, acquired immune deficiency
7		synd	rome, or the treatment of these conditions;
8	(2)	A ch	ronic or debilitating disease or medical condition
9		or i	ts treatment that produces one or more of the
10		foll	owing:
11		(A)	Cachexia or wasting syndrome;
12		(B)	Severe pain;
13		(C)	Severe nausea;
14		(D)	Seizures, including those characteristic of
15			epilepsy; or
16		(E)	Severe and persistent muscle spasms, including
17			those characteristic of multiple sclerosis or
18			Crohn's disease; [or]

1	(3)	Posttraumatic stress disorder, as defined in the most
2		recent edition of the Diagnostic and Statistical
3		Manual of Mental Disorders; provided that a diagnosis
4		of posttraumatic stress disorder has been made by a
5		licensed physician within a three-year period
6		immediately preceding the medical use of marijuana; or
7	[-(3) -]	(4) Any other medical condition approved by the
8		department of health pursuant to administrative rules
9		in response to a request from a physician or
10		potentially qualifying patient."
