A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. While child sexual abuse statistics vary, most
- 2 research studies show between seventeen and twenty-five per cent
- 3 of girls and between seven and sixteen per cent of boys will
- 4 experience sexual abuse before the age of eighteen. The
- 5 emotional and physical pain suffered in childhood often results
- 6 in depression, drug addiction, suicide, teenage pregnancy, and
- 7 juvenile delinquency. Child sexual abuse crosses the boundaries
- 8 of every economic level and ethnic and religious group.
- 9 The legislature finds that child sexual abuse must be
- 10 addressed by increasing education and awareness, as well as
- 11 empowering survivors of abuse.
- 12 The purpose of this Act is to require the department of
- 13 education to adopt and implement a policy addressing child
- 14 sexual abuse and to establish a task force to investigate and
- 15 create strategies for reducing child sexual abuse throughout
- 16 Hawaii.
