A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	PART I		
2	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the State has a		
3	public interest in diversifying its economy and promoting the		
4	development of high-growth, entrepreneurial businesses. Job		
5	creation is at the top of every state's policy agenda. Recent		
6	reports from the National Governors Association have highlight		
7	the importance of fostering an entrepreneurial business		
8	environment and supporting high-growth businesses as a proven		
9	approach to creating high-wage jobs.		
10	Successful economic development outcomes in other states		
11	have demonstrated the effectiveness of a comprehensive state-		
12	level program establishing an entrepreneurial ecosystem that		
13	fosters entrepreneurialism, commercialization, and business		
14	formation capabilities needed by high-growth businesses. This		
15	comprehensive program must have input and support from the key		
16	stakeholders in the entrepreneurial ecosystem: private		
17	industries, investors, universities, and government. Finally,		
18	this comprehensive program must have sufficient resources to

- 1 provide the pace and scale of investment needed to make it
- 2 effective.
- 3 The purpose of this part is to enable the Hawaii strategic
- 4 development corporation to continue with the HI growth
- 5 initiative, an investment program that is establishing an
- 6 innovation ecosystem by supporting entrepreneurial high-growth
- 7 businesses and creating high-wage jobs through research
- 8 commercialization, entrepreneur mentoring, and the mobilization
- 9 of startup investment capital.
- 10 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 11 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 12 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2013-2014 and the
- 13 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 14 2014-2015 to be deposited into the Hawaii strategic development
- 15 corporation revolving fund.
- 16 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the Hawaii
- 17 strategic development corporation revolving fund the sum of
- 18 \$ or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 19 2013-2014 and the same amount or so much thereof as may be
- 20 necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 to implement the HI growth
- 21 initiative; provided that \$ or so much thereof as may be
- 22 necessary in each fiscal year shall be expended for program

- 1 development, program management, and oversight of program
- 2 awardees.
- 3 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii
- 4 strategic development corporation for the purposes of this part.
- 5 SECTION 4. The Hawaii strategic development corporation
- 6 shall submit an annual report on the activities and expenditures
- 7 of the HI growth initiative to the legislature no later than
- 8 twenty days prior to the convening of each regular session,
- 9 beginning with the regular session of 2014.
- 10 PART II
- 11 SECTION 5. One of the missions of the department of
- 12 business, economic development, and tourism is to promote
- 13 industrial development and economic diversification by
- 14 supporting existing and emerging industries, increasing exports
- 15 of Hawaii products, and expanding Hawaii's participation in
- 16 global trade and commerce. The department has prepared a
- 17 statewide comprehensive economic development strategy. The
- 18 strategy's report for the island of Hawaii found that, because
- 19 of the island's strong orientation toward diversified
- 20 agriculture, development of a central marketing facility for
- 21 collection, consolidation, packing, and shipping of products
- 22 continues to be a priority. As a means of achieving this

- 1 priority, agricultural exporters have expressed interest in
- 2 utilizing the relatively unused foreign trade zone no. 9 located
- 3 in Hilo.
- 4 The legislature also recognizes that agriculture is and has
- 5 been a major economic driver of the county of Hawaii. To
- 6 preserve this economic driver and increase its value, the
- 7 department of business, economic development, and tourism, in
- 8 collaboration with the department of agriculture, should perform
- 9 planning, and economic impact and feasibility studies, for one
- 10 or more facilities on the island of Hawaii for quarantine
- 11 inspection, quarantine treatment, deconsolidation, and
- 12 consolidation of agricultural commodities for both import and
- 13 export.
- 14 The purpose of this part is to authorize the department of
- 15 business, economic development, and tourism, in collaboration
- 16 with the department of agriculture to:
- 17 (1) Perform planning and feasibility studies for one or
- 18 more quarantine inspection, quarantine treatment,
- 19 deconsolidation, and consolidation facilities on the
- 20 island of Hawaii; and
- 21 (2) Perform a marketing and economic impact analysis for
- one or more of the facilities.

1	SECTION 6. (a) The department of business, economic		
2	developme	nt, and tourism, in collaboration with the department	
3	of agricu	lture, is authorized to:	
4	(1)	Perform planning and feasibility studies for one or

10	(b)	The studies and analysis shall include, in addition to

13	(1)	The land parcel managed by the department of business

15		the foreign trade zone neighboring the Hilo	
16		International Airport; and	
17	(2)	On the west side of the island, the Kawaihae Harbor	
18		area that is proposed for biosecurity facilities by	
19		the department of transportation, harbors division.	
20	SECT	ION 7. The department of business, economic	
21	development, and tourism shall submit a report to the		
22	legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of

- 1 the regular session of 2015 on the status of the planning and
- 2 feasibility study, and marketing and economic analysis, for one
- 3 or more facilities on the island of Hawaii to be used for
- 4 quarantine inspection, quarantine treatment, deconsolidation,
- 5 and consolidation of incoming and outgoing agricultural
- 6 commodities. The report shall also contain recommendations and
- 7 propose necessary legislation, if any, to achieve the purpose of
- 8 this part.
- 9 SECTION 8. There is appropriated out of the general
- 10 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 11 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 for
- 12 planning, marketing, and economic analysis for one or more
- 13 facilities on the island of Hawaii to be used for quarantine
- 14 inspection, quarantine treatment, deconsolidation, and
- 15 consolidation of incoming and outgoing agricultural commodities.
- 16 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 17 business, economic development, and tourism for the purposes of
- 18 this part.

- 20 SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

Report Title:

Hawaii Strategic Development Corporation; HI Growth Initiative; Quarantine; Appropriation

Description:

Appropriates funds to the Hawaii Strategic Development Corporation to continue the HI Growth Initiative, an investment program to support high-growth entrepreneurial companies in the State. Requires annual report to Legislature. Authorizes DBEDT, in collaboration with DOA, to perform studies and analysis relating to establishing facilities on the Island of Hawaii for quarantine inspection and treatment and handling incoming and outgoing commodities and appropriates funds for this purpose. Effective July 1, 2050. (SB718 HD1)

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
