A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 141, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 3 and to read as follows:
- 4 "\$141- Department of agriculture lands; disposition;
- 5 agribusiness development corporation. The department of
- 6 agriculture may, as necessary, lease or otherwise dispose of
- 7 lands under its control to the agribusiness development
- 8 corporation for the agribusiness development corporation's use
- 9 for the purposes of chapter 163D."
- 10 SECTION 2. Chapter 166E, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 11 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 12 and to read as follows:
- 13 "\$166E- Lease negotiation. Any provision of this
- 14 chapter to the contrary notwithstanding, the department may
- 15 directly negotiate and enter into leases with the agribusiness
- 16 development corporation and shall be exempt from any
- 17 qualification requirements."

1	SECTION 3. Section 166E-8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended to read as follows:
3	"[+]\$166E-8[+] Disposition. (a) Any provision of this
4	chapter to the contrary notwithstanding, the department may
5	dispose of:
6	(1) Public lands and related facilities set aside and
7	designated for use pursuant to this chapter; and
8	(2) Other lands and facilities under the jurisdiction of
9	the department pursuant to section 166E-9 and
10	notwithstanding chapter 171,
11	by negotiation, drawing of lot, conversion, or public auction.
12	Except as provided by subsection (d), the department shall
13	dispose of public lands by lease.
14	(b) In all dispositions, the department shall be subject
15	to the requirements set forth in rules adopted by the board
16	consistent with section 166E-6 and subject to the following:
17	(1) All land and facilities shall be disposed of for
18	purposes of agricultural or aquacultural activities
19	only;
20	(2) Each lessee shall derive a major portion of the
21	lessee's total annual income earned from the lessee's

2		rest	riction shall not apply if:
3		(A)	Failure to meet the restriction results from
4			mental or physical disability or the loss of a
5			spouse; or
6		(B)	The premises are fully used in the production of
7			crops or products for which the disposition was
8			granted;
9	(3)	The	lessee shall comply with all federal and state
10		laws	regarding environmental quality control;
11	(4)	The	board shall:
12		(A)	Determine the specific uses for which the
13			disposition is intended;
14		(B)	Parcel the land into minimum size economic units
15			sufficient for the intended uses;
16		(C)	Make, or require the lessee to make, improvements
17			that are required to achieve the intended uses;
18		(D)	Set the upset price or lease rent based upon an
19			appraised evaluation of the property value,
20			adjustable to the specified use of the lot;
21		(E)	Set the term of the lease that shall be not less
22			than fifteen years nor more than sixty-five

1		years, including any extension granted for
2		mortgage lending or guarantee purposes; and
3		(F) Establish other terms and conditions it deems
4		necessary, including but not limited to
5		restrictions against alienation and provisions
6		for withdrawal by the board; and
7	(5)	Any transferee, assignee, or sublessee of a non-
8		agricultural park lease shall first qualify as an
9		applicant under this chapter. For the purpose of this
10		paragraph, any transfer, assignment, sale, or other
11		disposition of any interest, excluding a security
12		interest, by any legal entity that holds a non-
13		agricultural park lease shall be treated as a transfer
14		of the non-agricultural park lease and shall be
15		subject to the approval of the board and to reasonable
16		terms and conditions, consistent with this chapter or
17		rules of the board that the board may deem necessary.
18		No transfer shall be approved by the board if the
19		disposition of the stock or assets or other interest
20		of the legal entity would result in the failure of the
21		entity to qualify for a non-agricultural park land
22		lease.

4	the board	to cancel the lease and take possession of the land.
5	(d)	The board may issue easements, licenses, permits, and

19		reasonable terms and conditions, consistent with this
20		chapter or rules of the board that the board may deem
21		necessary;

1	(2)	Any disposition of lands or facilities to the
2		agribusiness development corporation shall be for the
3		purpose of agricultural or aquacultural activities, or
4		shall otherwise promote the purpose established in
5		chapter 163D; and
6	(3)	The agribusiness development corporation shall not
7		attempt to, nor make any agreement to, sell any leased
8		non-agricultural park land."

Report Title:

Department of Agriculture; Disposition of Lands; Agribusiness Development Corporation

Description:

Authorizes the department of agriculture to dispose of lands to the agribusiness development corporation. Exempts non-agricultural parks lands disposed to the agribusiness development corporation from section 166-8, HRS. Allows department of agriculture to negotiate and enter into leases with the agribusiness development corporation.
