A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC SCHOOL LANDS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that one of the major
- 2 educational dilemmas of our time is rooted in an existing system
- 3 that traps information-age students in agricultural-age schools.
- 4 While the flow of information and ideas is increasingly fluid,
- 5 students are confined to the physical structures and mindsets of
- 6 an earlier time and place. Building, repairing, and
- 7 retrofitting public schools to meet the challenges of the
- 8 twenty-first century and beyond will not be easy, and the costs
- 9 will be considerable. However, quality school infrastructure
- 10 facilitates an environment that will prepare children to achieve
- 11 and succeed in a highly competitive economy.
- 12 The considerable amount of underused public school lands on
- 13 the State's two hundred fifty-seven school campuses is an
- 14 untapped resource that lies within reach and would facilitate
- 15 infrastructure that could make classrooms and campuses suitable
- 16 for twenty-first century learning. By way of illustration, a
- 17 preliminary review by a real estate expert indicates that ten
- parcels that have unused lands are valued at \$120,000,000 under

existing surrounding uses. These lands could be developed 1 2 solely for the benefit of Hawaii's public school children. beneficiaries would be the children of Hawaii. 3 The purpose of this Act is to optimize the use of public 4 school lands to generate opportunities to improve public school 5 6 facilities and infrastructure to meet the challenges of the twenty-first century and, overall, to improve the quality of 7 education in Hawaii. In particular, this Act establishes a 8 9 three-year pilot project to generate revenue from uses such as 10 workforce housing to build and retrofit twenty-first century 11 schools. The pilot project will lay important groundwork for a statewide approach and plan to optimize public school lands and 12 modernize public school facilities. This Act also establishes a 13 14 school facilities advisory board to provide guidance to the department of education on ways to optimize the use of public 15 school lands, and creates the school facilities special fund to 16 17 deposit all proceeds generated from the use or lease of public 18 school lands. Moneys in the school facilities special fund will 19 be used to build or upgrade twenty-first century school 20 facilities.

1	SECTION 2. Cha	pter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding tw	o new sections to be appropriately
3	designated and to re	ad as follows:
4	" <u>§302A-A</u> <u>Lease</u>	of lands under the control of the board.
5	(a) Notwithstanding	sections 302A-1151 and 171-13, or any other
6	law to the contrary,	the department, with the approval of the
7	board, may lease public school land on terms it deems	
8	appropriate; provided that:	
9	(1) The depart	ment may lease public school land for not
10	more than	ten existing schools under a lease for a
11	term of no	t more than fifty-five years to a lessee who
12	shall be r	equired to construct workforce rental
13	housing un	its at affordable rental rates in accordance
14	with speci	fic request for proposal guidelines; and
15	(2) The lease	stipulates that the lessee may retain the
16	rental pro	ceeds; provided that:
17	(A) The 1	essee shall be obligated to maintain and
18	opera	te the workforce rental housing units for
19	the 1	ength of the lease;
20	(B) The 1	essee shall be subject to payment to the
21	count	y of all property tax on the value of the
22	non-s	chool improvements;

1	<u>(C</u>	A leasehold premium shall be paid for the right
2		to use the land based upon a competitive bid
3		process pursuant to chapter 103D; and
4	(D) Upon the expiration of the lease, the workforce
5		rental housing units shall revert to the
6		department.
7	(b) As	additional compensation, the board may require a
8	lessee to construct a new public school or substantially remodel	
9	existing schools at no cost to the board, department, and State	
10	provided that the design, construction plans, and specification	
11	for the public school shall be specifically provided by the	
12	department at the direction of the board, and be specifically	
13	detailed in the request for proposal bid process in accordance	
14	with chapter 103D.	
15	(c) Th	e lessee shall be selected by the department with a
16	recommendation to the board after a competitive bid process is	
17	conducted pu	rsuant to chapter 103D.
18	(d) Us	es permitted under a lease shall include:
19	<u>(1)</u> Wo	orkforce rental housing units and uses ancillary to
20	th	e rental housing community that are in accordance
21	wi	th applicable zoning ordinances; and
22	<u>(2)</u> <u>Pu</u>	blic schools.

1	(e) All leased land revenues and proceeds generated from		
2	public school lands pursuant to this section shall be deposited		
3	into the school facilities special fund established under		
4	section 171C-21.		
5	§302A-B School facilities advisory board. There is		
6	established within the department a school facilities advisory		
7	board to be composed of seven real estate, land use development,		
8	and education professionals. Members of the advisory board		
9	shall be appointed by the board and shall provide the department		
10	with advice, expertise, and guidance on the construction,		
11	management, and redevelopment of public school lands and		
12	facilities. Members of the advisory board shall serve without		
13	compensation but shall be reimbursed for travel expenses		
14	incurred in the performance of their duties. The advisory board		
15	may advise the department in the following activities, to		
16	include but not be limited to:		
17	(1) Identifying excess and underused public school lands		
18	and public school land sites with the potential for		
19	redevelopment;		
20	(2) Developing a strategic plan and implementation		
21	schedule for the redevelopment of public school lands;		

1	(3)	consistent with the department's strategic plans,
2		preparing development plans for school sites that have
3		the potential to generate revenues along with
4		improving school facilities at the respective sites;
5		and
6	(4)	Recommending the issuance of special purpose revenue
7		bonds for the purpose of loaning or otherwise applying
8		bond proceeds in accordance with redevelopment
9		projects approved by the department."
10	SECT	ION 3. (a) Within twelve months of the effective date
11	of this A	ct, in collaboration with the school facilities
12	advisory	board, the department of education shall:
13	(1)	Research, evaluate, and where appropriate implement
14		measures to further develop a systematic process,
15		mechanism, and policies to optimize the use of public
16		school lands to build, upgrade, and renovate all
17		schools to enable students to compete in the twenty-
18		first century;
19	(2)	Recommend legislation relating to the statutory and
20		procedural changes required to resolve pending land
21		tenure issues relating to the use, sale, or lease of

1	public school lands, which may include the creation of			
2	a public schools land trust; and			
3	(3) Develop a comprehensive master plan and implementation			
4	schedule to optimize public school lands for the			
5	development of twenty-first century schools.			
6	(b) The department of education, in collaboration with the			
7	school facilities advisory board shall submit a report to the			
8	legislature, including a summary of the department's activities,			
9	results, and recommendations to optimize the use of public			
10	school lands as a means to build or renovate twenty-first			
11	century schools, no later than twenty days prior to the			
12	convening of the 2015 regular session.			
13	SECTION 4. In codifying the new sections added by section			
14	2 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute			
15	appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating			
16	the new sections in this Act.			
17	SECTION 5. New statutory material is underscored.			
18	SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;			
19	provided that section 302A-A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, in			
20	section 2 of this Act shall be repealed on June 30, 2016.

Education; Public School Lands; Leases; Tax Credit

Description:

Permits the department of education, with the approval of the board of education, to lease certain public school lands for the development of affordable workforce housing rental units under specified conditions. Establishes the school facilities special fund.
