#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. The purpose of this Act is to require public	
2	disclosur	e of the information contained in the daily calendar of	
3	the gover	nor, lieutenant governor, state department directors,	
4	and state agency heads.		
5	SECT	ION 2. Section 92F-12, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
6	amended t	o read as follows:

9	make avai	lable for public inspection and duplication during

12		applicability, statements of general policy, and	
13		interpretations of general applicability adopted by	
14		the agency;	
15	(2)	Final opinions, including concurring and dissenting	
16		opinions, as well as orders made in the adjudication	
17		of cases, except to the extent protected by section	
18		92F-13(1);	

1	(3)	Government purchasing information, including all bid
2		results, except to the extent prohibited by section
3		92F-13;
4	(4)	Pardons and commutations, as well as directory
5		information concerning an individual's presence at an
6		correctional facility;
7	(5)	Land ownership, transfer, and lien records, including
8		real property tax information and leases of state
9		land;
10	(6)	Results of environmental tests;
11	(7)	Minutes of all agency meetings required by law to be
12		<pre>public;</pre>
13	(8)	Name, address, and occupation of any person borrowing
14		funds from a state or county loan program, and the
15		amount, purpose, and current status of the loan;
16	(9)	Certified payroll records on public works contracts
17		except social security numbers and home addresses;
18	(10)	Regarding contract hires and consultants employed by
19		agencies:
20		(A) The contract itself, the amount of compensation;
21		(B) The duration of the contract; and
