### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO WITNESSES.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

The legislature finds that the per diem stipend 1 SECTION 1. amount for out-of-state witnesses has remained static for a 2 number of years. This amount is no longer sufficient to pay the 3 personal expenses of out-of-state witnesses, such as lodging and 4 5 food. Often these individuals are forced to take money out of their own pockets to cover necessary personal expenses when 6 subpoenaed to return to the State as a witness in state court 7 8 proceedings.

Because the per diem stipend amount has not been adjusted 9 to keep pace with the cost of living in Hawaii, it has emerged 10 as an economic "barrier" that either discourages or prevents an 11 12 out-of-state witness from pursuing charges against offenders due to economic considerations. Further, the legislature also finds 13 that the per diem stipend amount for witnesses that are required 14 to travel to a different island is also not sufficient to cover 15 the witness' personal expenses when that witness is required to 16 17 stay overnight.

The purpose of this Act is to increase the amount of per 1 diem stipends for out-of-state witnesses as well as make 2 3 available additional amounts of per diem stipends for a witness who must travel to another island, if that witness is required 4 5 to stay overnight. SECTION 2. Section 621-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 6 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 7 "(a) Every witness legally required to attend a state 8 9 court or grand jury in any criminal case, other than a public 10 officer or employee, shall be entitled to \$20 for each day's 11 attendance and a reasonable mileage fee to be established 12 pursuant to rules adopted by the judiciary for each mile actually and necessarily traveled on the ground each way, 13 including travel to and from the nearest airport when required 14 to travel from another island or from outside the State. 15 16 In addition to witness' fees, every witness [, who]: Who attends a state court from outside the State shall 17 (1) be entitled to the actual round-trip cost of plane 18 travel, plus [\$110] \$145 per twenty-four-hour day  $[\tau]$ ; 19 20 or [<del>if</del>] Who attends a state court from any island in the State 21 (2) other than that on which the court holds session[-7]22

Report Title: Witnesses in Criminal Cases; Per Diem Payments

#### Description:

Amends section 621-7, HRS, to increase the per diem payments for out-of-state witnesses in criminal cases from \$110 to \$145. Provides an additional \$90 per diem payment for witnesses from any island other than the island on which the court is located, when that witness is required to stay overnight.
