# A BILL FOR AN ACT

PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE XVII, SECTION 3, OF THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF HAWAII.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Article XVII, section 3, of the Constitution of
- 2 the State of Hawaii is amended to read as follows:
- 3 "AMENDMENTS PROPOSED BY LEGISLATURE
- 4 Section 3. The legislature may propose amendments to the
- 5 constitution by adopting the same, in the manner required for
- 6 legislation, by a two-thirds vote of each house on final reading
- 7 at any session, after either or both houses shall have given the
- 8 governor at least ten days' written notice of the final form of
- 9 the proposed amendment, or, with or without such notice, by a
- 10 majority vote of each house on final reading at each of two
- 11 successive sessions.
- 12 Upon such adoption, the proposed amendments shall be
- 13 entered upon the journals, with the ayes and noes, and published
- 14 once in each of four successive weeks in at least one newspaper
- 15 of general circulation in each senatorial district wherein such
- 16 a newspaper is published, within the two months' period
- 17 immediately preceding the next general election.



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At such general election the proposed amendments shall be
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    submitted to the electorate for approval or rejection upon a
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    separate ballot.
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         [The conditions of and requirements for ratification of
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    such proposed amendments shall be the same as provided in
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    section 2 of this article for ratification at a general
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    election.] The full text of any proposed amendment shall be made
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    available for inspection on the website of the office of
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    elections at least days before such general election.
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    Each amendment shall be submitted in the form of a question
    embracing but one subject; provided that each question shall
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    have designated spaces to mark YES or NO on the amendment.
         The amendment shall be effective only if approved at a
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    general election by a majority of the votes tallied upon the
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    question, this majority constituting at least fifty per cent of
    the total votes cast at the election, or at a special election
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    by a majority of all the votes tallied upon the question, this
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    majority constituting at least thirty per cent of the total
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    number of registered voters. Only affirmative and negative
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    votes shall be tallied upon the question; blank ballots and
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    spoiled ballots shall not be tallied upon the question.
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1	The provisions of this section shall be self-executing;
2	provided that the legislature shall make any necessary
3	appropriations and may enact legislation to facilitate their
4	operation."
5	SECTION 2. The question to be printed on the ballot shall
6	be as follows:
7	"Shall only yes or no votes be counted in determining
8	whether or not a majority of voters have approved or
9	ratified constitutional amendment proposed by the
10	legislature?"
11	SECTION 3. Constitutional material to be repealed is
12	bracketed and stricken. New constitutional material is
13	underscored.
14	SECTION 4. This amendment shall take effect upon
15	compliance with article XVII, section 3, of the Constitution of
16	the State of Hawaii.
