SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

DESIGNATING THE SERPENT'S HEAD COWRY SHELL AS THE HAWAII STATE
SEA SHELL.

1 WHEREAS, the *Monetaria caputserpentis*, commonly known as
2 the serpent's head cowry, is a species of cowry, or sea snail,
3 which is a marine gastropod mollusk and is in the family
4 Cypraeidae; and

6 WHEREAS, this species occurs in the Red Sea, Indian Ocean,
7 tropical Indo-West Pacific, Australia, and the Philippines, and
8 lives on corals, rock reefs, and rocky shores from the
9 intertidal zone down to depths of two hundred meters; and

11 WHEREAS, the snake head or the serpent's head cowry is the
12 most common type of cowry found in Hawaii; and

14 WHEREAS, the shell of the serpent's head cowry is
15 considered one of the most beautiful cowry shells; now,
16 therefore,

18 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-seventh
19 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2014, the
20 House of Representatives concurring, that the serpent's head
21 cowry shell be designated as the Hawaii state sea shell; and

23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
24 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor and the
25 Chairperson of the Board of Land and Natural Resources.
