## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE AUDITOR TO ASSESS THE SOCIAL AND FINANCIAL EFFECTS OF REQUIRING HEALTH INSURANCE COVERAGE FOR ANNUAL BODY MASS INDEX MEASUREMENTS FOR CHILDREN.

WHEREAS, childhood obesity is a serious medical condition affecting Hawaii's children and adolescents; and

WHEREAS, childhood obesity often leads to health problems that were once limited to adults such as diabetes, high blood pressure, and high cholesterol; and

WHEREAS, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, body mass index is a reliable indicator of body fat; and

WHEREAS, section 23-51, Hawaii Revised Statutes, requires that "[b]efore any legislative measure that mandates health insurance coverage for specific health services, specific diseases, or certain providers of health care services as part of individual or group health insurance policies, can be considered, there shall be concurrent resolutions passed requesting the auditor to prepare and submit to the legislature a report that assesses both the social and financial effects of the proposed mandated coverage"; and

WHEREAS, section 23-51, Hawaii Revised Statutes, further provides that "[t]he concurrent resolutions shall designate a specific legislative bill that:

- (1) Has been introduced in the legislature; and
- (2) Includes, at minimum, information identifying the:
  - (A) Specific health service, disease, or provider that would be covered;

Extent of the coverage; (B) 1 2 Target groups that would be covered; 3 (C) 4 5 (D) Limits on utilization, if any; and 6 Standards of care. 7 (E) 8 9 For purposes of this part, mandated health insurance coverage shall not include mandated optional"; and 10 11 WHEREAS, section 23-52, Hawaii Revised Statutes, further 12 specifies the minimum information required to be included in the 13 Auditor's report; and 14 15 16 WHEREAS, S.B. No. 2351 (Regular Session of 2014) requires primary care physicians and pediatricians to provide an annual 17 body mass index measurement to patients from age two to eighteen 18 19 years; and 20 WHEREAS, S.B. No. 2351 (Regular Session of 2014) requires 21 primary care physicians and pediatricians to annually report 22 23 anonymous age and body mass index statistics to the Department of Health; and 24 25 WHEREAS, S.B. No. 2351 (Regular Session of 2014) mandates 26 all individual and group insurance policies to provide coverage 27 for body mass index measurements for individuals from age two to 28 29 eighteen years; and 30 WHEREAS, the Legislature believes that mandatory health 31 insurance coverage for body mass index measurement for children, 32 as provided in S.B. No. 2351 (Regular Session of 2014), will 33 substantially reduce illness and health care costs; now, 34 therefore, 35 36 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-seventh 37 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2014, the 38 House of Representatives concurring, that the Auditor is 39 requested to conduct an impact assessment pursuant to sections

23-51 and 23-52, Hawaii Revised Statutes, of the social and financial effects of mandating health insurance coverage for

2351 (Regular Session of 2014); and
