## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE CONVENING OF A COTTAGE FOOD BUSINESS WORKING GROUP COMPRISING REPRESENTATIVES FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND THE COTTAGE FOOD INDUSTRY.

WHEREAS, in recent years, as the local food movement has 1 become more popular, more states have added or improved their 2 cottage food laws to allow home food businesses to exist 3 legally; and 4 5 6 WHEREAS, cottage food laws are different in every state, but each law allows home food sales in some way; and more than 7 30 states have laws or regulations permitting direct-to-consumer 8 sales of non-potentially hazardous foods prepared in a home 9 kitchen: and 10 11 WHEREAS, in Hawaii, temporary food establishment permits 12 issued by the Department of Health for cottage food businesses 13 are invaluable for local entrepreneurship and the establishment 14 of a local, sustainable food industry, which contributes to a 15 thriving local economy; and 16 17 WHEREAS, temporary food establishment permits make it 18 possible to vend products produced in a home kitchen directly to 19 consumers at bake sales, food swaps, farm stands, or farmers' 20 markets; and 21 22 WHEREAS, temporary food establishment permits issued by the 23 24 Department of Health restrict a vendor to doing business for no more than 20 days in any 120-day period, after which time 25 another permit must be acquired; and 26 27 WHEREAS, although this reapplication process may be 28 appropriate in some circumstances, it precludes cottage food 29 operators from growing their cottage food business; furthermore, 30 all foods originating from home kitchens are considered to be 31



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1 unapproved sources for permitted food establishments within the 2 State; and 3 WHEREAS, a permitting process that would not force vendors 4 engaged in the direct sale of cottage foods to consumers to 5 reapply every 120 days would be beneficial to the growth of the 6 7 cottage food business in Hawaii; and 8 WHEREAS, California's Homemade Food Act permits cottage 9 food operators to use and sell food from home kitchens, which 10 means cottage food operators no longer have to rent out 11 expensive space from commercial kitchens; and 12 13 WHEREAS, since the passage of California's Homemade Food 14 Act, there has been no increase in reported cases of food-borne 15 16 illness that can be attributed to non-hazardous foods produced in a home kitchen; and 17 18 WHEREAS, authorizing home kitchens for a temporary food 19 establishment permit would also be beneficial to the growth of 20 21 the cottage food business in Hawaii; now, therefore, 22 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-seventh 23 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2014, the 24 House of Representatives concurring, that the Ulupono Initiative 25 26 and/or the Local Food Coalition is requested to convene a cottage food business working group comprising representatives 27 from the Department of Health and the cottage food industry; and 28 29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the cottage food business 30 working group is requested to examine title 11, chapter 50, 31 Hawaii Administrative Rules, relating to the Food Safety Code, 32 to consider the following: 33 34 What restrictions, if any, these rules may place on 35 (1) the cottage food industry in Hawaii; 36 37 (2) Issues relating to the permitting process, including a 38 permit that would not require vendors engaged in 39 direct sales to consumers to reapply every one hundred 40 twenty days or pay any associated permitting fees; 41
