## SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THAT THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII EXPAND THE OSHER
LIFELONG LEARNING INSTITUTE TO INCLUDE ALL OF THE CAMPUSES
WITHIN THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII SYSTEM.

WHEREAS, our kupuna, or senior members of our society, are an important component of our society, contributing wisdom and depth to our communities; and

WHEREAS, according to the United States Department of Labor, the population of people aged 65 to 69 years old will rise by 37 percent from 2010 to 2020, while the number of people aged 70 years and older will rise by 38 percent nationwide; and

WHEREAS, the rising number of people aged 75 and older is exponentially greater in the State of Hawaii with an increase of 116 percent from 1990 to 2012; and

WHEREAS, along with the wisdom and experience that come with age, declines in mental and physical health, such as those resulting from dementia and Alzheimer's disease, can also occur; and

WHEREAS, Jean Carper's book, "100 Simple Things You Can Do to Prevent Alzheimer's and Age-Related Memory Loss" lists continuing education as one of the ways to maintain mental health; and

WHEREAS, the University of Hawaii has established a program called the Osher Lifelong Learning Institute, to help our kupuna stay mentally active by giving them an opportunity to take classes free of charge; and

WHEREAS, this program is currently only available at the Manoa campus of the University of Hawaii on the south side of Oahu; and
