RELATING TO THE MOTION PICTURES, DIGITAL MEDIA, <u>SB 2079, SD2</u> AND FILM PRODUCTION INCOME TAX CREDIT. (SSCR2799) Requires film productions to comply with federal, state, and county Status laws and secure all necessary film permit approvals with appropriate state or county film offices and any appropriate state or county agencies if a film production takes place on state or county property, in order to be eligible for the motion picture, digital media, and film production income tax credit. Prohibits qualified production costs that have been financed with state funds from qualifying for the motion picture, digital media, and film production income tax credit after 7/1/2014. Prohibits reality television from qualifying for the tax credit. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2) RELATING TO THE PACIFIC INTERNATIONAL SPACE <u>SB 2583, SD1</u> CENTER FOR EXPLORATION SYSTEMS AND NATIONAL (SSCR2735) AERONAUTICS AND SPACE ADMINISTRATION LASER Status COMMUNICATIONS GROUND STATION INITIATIVE. Appropriates funds for an engineering assessment of a proposal to establish a laser optical communications ground station in Hawaii. Effective 07/01/2050. (SD1) RELATING TO THE PACIFIC INTERNATIONAL SPACE SB 2584, SD1 (SSCR2801) CENTER FOR EXPLORATION SYSTEMS' PLANETARY SUSTAINABILITY TECHNOLOGIES INITIATIVE. <u>Status</u> Appropriates funds to support planetary sustainability technology demonstrations and university-based competitions. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)

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<u>SB 2776, SD2</u> (<u>SSCR2802)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT. Requires the board of directors of the high technology development corporation to create a film and media park. Designates certain properties to be included in the park. Appropriates funds. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)	EDB, FIN
<u>SB 2832, SD2</u> (<u>SSCR2775)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HIGH TECHNOLOGY. Amends section 206M-15, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to add a Small Business Innovation Research program award or contract as a qualifying criterion for grants from the High Technology Development Corporation. Increases the ceiling on any single transfer from the Hawaii capital loan revolving fund for grants from \$100,000 to an unspecified amount. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)	EDB, FIN
<u>SB 3126, SD2</u> (<u>SSCR2573)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO EMPLOYMENT AGREEMENTS. Prohibits noncompete agreements and restrictive covenants in employment contracts, post-employment contracts, or separation agreements that forbid post-employment competition of employees of a technology business or licensed physicians.
