<u>SB 2179</u> Status & Testimony	RELATING TO SOLAR ENERGY. Authorizes condominium owners in a condominium structure of no more than three stories in height to place solar energy devices on the roof, under certain conditions.		ENE, CPN
<u>SB 2178</u> <u>Status &</u> <u>Testimony</u>	RELATING TO ENERGY. Permits the installation of clotheslines in any residential dwelling or townhouse. Defines a reasonable restriction on the placement and use of clotheslines as any restriction that is necessary to protect public health and safety, buildings from damage, historic or aesthetic values, and shorelines under certain circumstances.
