Authorizes issuance of general obligation bonds. Makes findings required by article VII, section 13 of the state constitution to declare that issuance of authorized bonds will not cause the debt limit to be

RELATING TO TAXATION.

Status

Reduces the tax liability for low-income taxpayers by creating a tax

credit that will eliminate a taxpayer's income tax liability if their federal adjusted gross income falls below federal poverty guidelines. Reduces a taxpayer's income tax liability by 50% if the taxpayer's federal adjusted gross income falls between 100-125% of federal

poverty guidelines.

Requires all general excise tax monthly returns to be filed

electronically, beginning on 1/1/2015.

HB 1870

RELATING TO TAXATION.

Status 5 4 1

Establishes a nonrefundable income tax credit for taxpayers who

purchase residential backup generators.

HB 1893 RELATING TO TAXATION. FIN. Status Authorizes income tax return designations to the American Red Cross Hawaii State Chapter. HB 2341 RELATING TO ELECTRONIC FILING AND PAYMENT OF FIN Status TAXES. Reduces the threshold amount for electronic fund transfers of taxes. HB 2342 RELATING TO ELECTRONIC FILING OF TAX RETURNS. FIN Allows the Department of Taxation to require the electronic filing of <u>Status</u> tax returns. HB 2432 RELATING TO TAXATION. FIN Excludes income received from deferred compensation retirement Status plans from the state income tax for taxpayers who meet certain income requirements. <u>HB 2464</u> RELATING TO TAX CREDITS. FIN <u>Status</u> Clarifies the amount of the important agricultural land qualified agricultural cost tax credit. HB 2508 RELATING TO THE USE OF FUNDS FOR PUBLIC FIN Status EMPLOYMENT COSTS. Restricts the use of funds appropriated or authorized for vacant state positions to the payment of salaries or wages. Expressly prohibits the use of these funds for vacation credit or payments for transferred or discharged state employees. HB 1958, HD1 RELATING TO COMPENSATION. LAB, FIN Adds flexibility to the calculation of overtime compensation for (HSCR34-14) Status government public works construction contracts greater than \$2,000 by providing that overtime compensation be not less than 11/2 times the laborers or mechanics basic hourly rate of pay plus fringe benefits. Specifies that the overtime rate be as specified in the collective bargaining agreement when the basic hourly rate is based on a collective bargaining agreement. HB 1974, HD1 RELATING TO WORKERS' COMPENSATION MEDICAL FEE LAB, FIN (HSCR19-14) SCHEDULE. Status Requires DLIR to update the workers' compensation medical fee schedule annually. Authorizes DLIR to establish a workers' compensation medical fee ceiling that exceeds 110% of the fees prescribed in the Medicare Resource Relative Value Scale for Hawaii. Makes appropriations. Effective July 1, 2014. Sunsets June 30, 2019.

HB 1977, HD1 (HSCR43-14) **Status** 

RELATING TO COLLECTIVE BARGAINING.

LAB, FIN Amends a provision of the final position in a collective bargaining arbitration to include only proposals that were submitted before impasse. Provides the arbitration panel with authority to determine if

final positions submitted are compliant with statutory requirements.

HB 2038, HD1 (HSCR15-14) Status RELATING TO HUMAN TRAFFICKING.

LAB, FIN

Establishes the Human Trafficking Victim Services Fund to be administered by the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations to

provide support and services to human trafficking victims. Effective

July 1, 2300.

HB 1605

RELATING TO CAMPAIGN SPENDING.

JUD, FIN

(HSCR54-14) Corrects mistaken reference to section of Hawaii Revised Statutes that was meant to exempt from contribution limits contributions from

immediate family, rather than from contractors.
