# HB 2008RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.(HSCR416-14)Appropriates funds to the Department of Education to operate and<br/>implement the Future Farmers of America Program. Effective July 1,<br/>2014.

# RELATING TO DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION SUPERINTENDENT'S SALARY.

Adjusts the salary cap of the Superintendent of Education. Allows the Board of Education to consider altering the Superintendent's benefits package. Requires the Board to submit a report to the Legislature each time it alters the Superintendent's salary.

# RELATING TO HAWAII 3R'S.

Renames the Hawaii 3R's school repair and maintenance fund the Hawaii 3R's school improvement fund. Requires the transfer of moneys collected pursuant to section 235-102.5(b), Hawaii Revised Statutes, and any other moneys received in the form of grants and donations for school-level improvements and minor repairs and maintenance to the Hawaii 3R's school improvement fund.

### RELATING TO EDUCATION.

Requires the Board of Education to develop and the Department of Education to implement a pilot program to assist students in achieving annual goals under the Common Core State Standards. Requires the Board of Education to provide web-based data and information aimed at improving student outcomes. Effective July 1, 2014. EDN, FIN

HB 2597, HD1 (HSCR412-14) Status	RELATING TO TEACHERS. Authorizes under the Teacher National Board Certification Incentive Program an additional \$5,000 per year bonus for teachers who maintain current national board certification and teach at a school in a focus, priority, or Superintendent's zone.	EDN, LAB, FIN
<u>HB 1925, HD1</u> ( <u>HSCR120-14)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO EDUCATION. Requires the administration of the Youth Risk Behavior Survey to students in grades six to twelve in odd-numbered years at selected Department of Education schools, public charter schools, and private schools. Effective July 1, 2014.	EDN, FIN
<u>HB 2109, HD1</u> ( <u>HSCR382-14)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO AFTERSCHOOL PROGRAMS FOR ELEMENTARY SCHOOL STUDENTS. Establishes and funds an evidence-based physical-activity and nutritional-education program within the A+ Program in Hawaii's public elementary schools. Appropriation. Effective July 1, 2014.	EDN, FIN
<u>HB 1746, HD1</u> (HSCR67-14) <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION. Establishes interagency working groups to discuss and create comprehensive plans to address various issues relating to Act 51, Session Laws of Hawaii 2004.	EDN, FIN
<u>HB 1776, HD2</u> (HSCR511-14) <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO EDUCATION. Adds a dental examination to existing medical requirements for initial entry into school in the State. Requires Board of Education to establish a pilot program to require a physical examination for entry into seventh grade in one complex area. Appropriation. Effective July 1, 2050.	EDN, HLT, FIN
<u>HB 1777, HD2</u> (HSCR512-14) <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO EDUCATION. Authorizes Department of Education employees and agents with specified training to volunteer to administer epinephrine to a student with anaphylaxis. Allows the Department of Education to make arrangements to receive injectable epinephrine supplies from manufacturers and suppliers. Effective July 1, 2050.	EDN, HLT, FIN
<u>HB 1675</u> ( <u>HSCR346-14)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO EDUCATION. Requires all public secondary schools to implement a school year that includes nine hundred ninety student instructional hours beginning with the 2014-2015 school year. Repeals the requirement that by the 2016-2018 school years, all public schools implement a school year of one hundred eighty days and one thousand eighty student instructional hours for both elementary and secondary school grades. Clarifies that the definition of "student instructional hours" shall be determined by the board of education.	EDN, FIN



<u>HB 1745, HD1</u> ( <u>HSCR404-14)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO EDUCATION. Authorizes the State Public Charter School Commission to assess fees on non-state entities and individuals to help offset its operating costs. Makes various amendments to the charter school law for clarity and consistency. Effective July 1, 2014.	EDN, FIN
HB 1676, HD1 (HSCR301-14) Status	RELATING TO EARLY LEARNING. Authorizes the Executive Office on Early Learning to enter into agreements with the Department of Education and public charter schools for use of vacant or underutilized classrooms as public preschool classrooms.	EDN, FIN
<u>HB 14, HD1</u> ( <u>HSCR373-14)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION. Amends the compulsory education law to make kindergarten mandatory. Develops a statewide individualized kindergarten readiness tool and establishes an individualized kindergarten readiness assessment process. Appropriates funds. Effective July 1, 2014.	EDN, FIN
<u>HB 2276</u> (HSCR365-14) <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION. Establishes the Early Childhood Education Program within the Early Learning System established by section 302L-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes.	EDN, FIN
