Requires the Board of Education to provide web-based data and information aimed at improving student outcomes. Effective July 1, 2014. RELATING TO EDUCATION. HB 2473 EDN, FIN Establishes an Education Innovation Grant Program to provide (HSCR251-14) Status teachers with resources to implement innovation initiatives aimed at increasing student academic achievement. HB 2597, HD1 RELATING TO TEACHERS. EDN, LAB, FIN Authorizes under the Teacher National Board Certification Incentive (HSCR412-14) Status Program an additional \$5,000 per year bonus for teachers who maintain current national board certification and teach at a school in a focus, priority, or Superintendent's zone. HB 1925, HD1 RELATING TO EDUCATION. EDN, FIN (HSCR120-14) Requires the administration of the Youth Risk Behavior Survey to Status students in grades six to twelve in odd-numbered years at selected Department of Education schools, public charter schools, and private schools. Effective July 1, 2014. HB 2109, HD1 RELATING TO AFTERSCHOOL PROGRAMS FOR EDN, FIN (HSCR382-14) ELEMENTARY SCHOOL STUDENTS. Establishes and funds an evidence-based physical-activity and **Status** nutritional-education program within the A+ Program in Hawaii's public elementary schools. Appropriation. Effective July 1, 2014. HB 1746, HD1 RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION. EDN, FIN (HSCR67-14) Establishes interagency working groups to discuss and create Status comprehensive plans to address various issues relating to Act 51, Session Laws of Hawaii 2004. <u>HB 1776, HD2</u> RELATING TO EDUCATION. EDN, HLT, FIN (HSCR511-14) Adds a dental examination to existing medical requirements for initial Status entry into school in the State. Requires Board of Education to establish a pilot program to require a physical examination for entry into seventh grade in one complex area. Appropriation. Effective July 1, 2050. HB 1777, HD2 RELATING TO EDUCATION. EDN, HLT, FIN (HSCR512-14) Authorizes Department of Education employees and agents with specified training to volunteer to administer epinephrine to a student Status

with anaphylaxis. Allows the Department of Education to make arrangements to receive injectable epinephrine supplies from

manufacturers and suppliers. Effective July 1, 2050.

HB 1675 (HSCR346-14) Status	RELATING TO EDUCATION. Requires all public secondary schools to implement a school year that includes nine hundred ninety student instructional hours beginning with the 2014-2015 school year. Repeals the requirement that by the 2016-2018 school years, all public schools implement a school year of one hundred eighty days and one thousand eighty student instructional hours for both elementary and secondary school grades. Clarifies that the definition of "student instructional hours" shall be determined by the board of education.	EDN, FIN
HB 1745, HD1 (HSCR404-14) Status	RELATING TO EDUCATION. Authorizes the State Public Charter School Commission to assess fees on non-state entities and individuals to help offset its operating costs. Makes various amendments to the charter school law for clarity and consistency. Effective July 1, 2014.	EDN, FIN
HB 1676, HD1 (HSCR301-14) Status	RELATING TO EARLY LEARNING. Authorizes the Executive Office on Early Learning to enter into agreements with the Department of Education and public charter schools for use of vacant or underutilized classrooms as public preschool classrooms.	EDN, FIN
HB 14, HD1 (HSCR373-14) Status	RELATING TO EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION. Amends the compulsory education law to make kindergarten mandatory. Develops a statewide individualized kindergarten readiness tool and establishes an individualized kindergarten readiness assessment process. Appropriates funds. Effective July 1, 2014.	EDN, FIN
<u>HB 2276</u> (HSCR365-14) <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION. Establishes the Early Childhood Education Program within the Early Learning System established by section 302L-2, Hawaii Revised	EDN, FIN
