HB 2207 Status	RELATING TO PSYCHOLOGISTS. Removes the requirement that applicants for a license in psychology complete one year of post doctoral training.	HLT, CPC
HB 2208 Status	RELATING TO CONTINUING EDUCATION. Requires licensed psychologists to complete a minimum of eighteen credit hours of continuing education courses for the licensing renewal period beginning July 1, 2014, through June 30, 2016. Requires at least three credit hours of continuing education to be ethics courses.	HLT, CPC
HB 1831 Status	RELATING TO HEALTH. Updates the scope of practice for chiropractic to reflect standards, practices, and terminology accepted by the National Board of Chiropractic Examiners.	HLT, CPC
HB 1880 Status	RELATING TO PODIATRISTS. Conforms the definition of "podiatric medicine" to national standards regarding diagnosis and treatment of the foot and ankle.	HLT, CPC
HB 1882 Status	RELATING TO PODIATRISTS. Adopts the national standard of a minimum of twenty-four months in an accredited podiatric residency prior to licensure as a podiatrist, beginning on 01/01/2015.	HLT, CPC
HB 2105 Status	RELATING TO VETERINARY TECHNICIANS. Establishes requirements for the practice and registration of veterinary technicians. Requires the Board of Veterinary Examiners to adopt rules. Effective July 1, 2014.	HLT, CPC
HB 2106 Status	RELATING TO PHARMACISTS. Requires pharmacists to complete a training program approved by the board of pharmacy to dispense veterinary prescriptions.	HILT, CPC
