HB 1812, HD1, SD1 (SSCR3015) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO LAW ENFORCEMENT. Requires additional detail and updating for annual reports to the Legislature of police misconduct; requires retention of disciplinary records for at least eighteen months after reporting; permits disclosure under the Freedom of Information Act of misconduct by a police officer that results in a suspension. Effective July 1, 2030. (SD1)	PSM, JDL
HB 1503, HD1, SD1 (SSCR2852) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO THE RESIDENTIAL LANDLORD-TENANT CODE. Voids any rental agreement provision that allows for eviction of a tenant who has a valid certificate for the medical use of marijuana unless: (1) the rental agreement allows for eviction for smoking tobacco and the medical marijuana is smoked; or (2) the documents of a condominium property regime or planned community association prohibit the medical use of marijuana. Effective 11/01/2014. (SD1)	CPN, JDL
HB 2666, HD1, SD1 (SSCR3038) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO PERSONAL INFORMATION. Makes permanent the amendments allowing a business to scan an individual's driver's license or identification card to verify age when providing age-restricted goods or services. Removes reference to "the business" from the reasonable doubt standard for proof of age. (SD1)	TEC/CPN, JDL
HB 1641, SD1 (SSCR3036) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO GOVERNMENTAL ACCESS TO STORED COMMUNICATIONS. Requires law enforcement to obtain: (1) a search warrant to compel production of the contents of electronic communications; and (2) a court order to compel production of historical transactional records. Effective July 1, 2020. (SD1)	TEC, JDL
