<u>HB 1958</u>

RELATING TO COMPENSATION.

LAB, FIN

Status-

Adds flexibility to the calculation of overtime compensation for government public works construction contracts greater than \$2,000 allowing such compensation to be not less than 1½ times the laborers or mechanics basic hourly rate of pay plus the cost of fringe benefits.

HB 1971

RELATING TO LABOR.

LAB, EDN, FIN

Status

Allows administrative, support, and instructional employees in charter schools to fully participate in the State's systems for certain employee benefits and additional supports and incentives offered by the

Department of Education.

<u>HB 1979</u>

RELATING TO PUBLIC OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES.

LAB, FIN

Status Authorizes the directors of all state departments to withhold or alter the benefits packages of excluded employees who are exempt from civil

service in exchange for higher compensation.

<u>HB 1977</u>

RELATING TO COLLECTIVE BARGAINING.

LAB, FIN

<u>Status</u>

Amends a provision of the final position in a collective bargaining

arbitration to include only proposals that were submitted before

impasse.

<u>HB 1500</u>

RELATING TO CONTRACTORS.

LAB, CPC

Status Defines "incidental and supplemental work" for purposes of

determining licensing requirements for general engineering and

general building contractors.

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

Persons wishing to offer comments should submit testimony at least 24 hours prior to the hearing. Testimony should indicate:
