<u>HB 2351</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO MOTOR CARRIER SAFETY. Amends or deletes statutes containing federal requirements that are addressed in Hawaii Administrative Rules.	TRN, JUD
HB 2352 Status	RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLE INSPECTIONS. Expands authority of the director of transportation over required motor vehicle and motor carrier vehicle inspections in the State.	TRN, CPC
HB 2393 Status	RELATING TO MOPEDS. Requires annual registration and inspection of mopeds. Requires operators of mopeds to enroll in safety courses to operate their mopeds. Increases the fine for modifying a moped to \$1,000. Effective January 1, 2015.	TRN, CPC/JUD
HB 2563 Status	RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION. Requires the Department of Transportation to conduct a feasibility study on the construction of an alternative access road into and out of the Leeward Coast of Oahu mauka of Farrington Highway beginning at Lualualei Naval Magazine Road. <u>HB 2428</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION. Appropriates state matching funds to the counties for road repair and repaving. Establishes additional requirements to qualify for the use of the state matching funds.	TRN, FIN
HB 1894 <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO A CAR-SHARING VEHICLE SURCHARGE TAX. Establishes a car-sharing vehicle surcharge tax.	TRN, FIN

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW
