Authorizes the issuance of general obligation bonds and the appropriation of funds for deposit into the rental housing trust fund and the dwelling unit revolving fund for the purposes of financing affordable rental housing development and infrastructure development. <u>SB 2267</u> (SSCR2031) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO HOUSING. Making an appropriation for the construction of micro apartment housing units.	HMS, WAM
<u>SB 2286, SD1</u> (SSCR2009) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO HOMELESSNESS. Prohibits provider agencies from requesting or requiring homeless individuals to purchase goods or food commodity under a food distribution program or any food stamp or coupon under a food stamp plan, or an EBT card or similar debit card type device, in exchange for services. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)	HMS, WAM
<u>SB 2337</u> (SSCR2004) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO LOW-INCOME HOUSING. Authorizes the issuance and appropriate of general obligation bonds to fund low-income housing tax credit loans.	HMS, WAM
<u>SB 2442</u> (SSCR2032) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO AFFORDABLE HOUSING. Appropriates funds for the rental housing trust fund to build affordable rental housing projects, including projects with micro units, family units, and elder housing units.	HMS, WAM
<u>SB 2525, SD1</u> (SSCR2033) <u>Status &</u> <u>Testimony</u>	RELATING TO PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES. Establishes the medicaid buy-in program for workers with disabilities and appropriates funds for outreach and training relating to the medicaid buy-in program for workers with disabilities. (SD1)	HMS, WAM



<u>SB 2534, SD1</u> (SSCR2005) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO HOMELESSNESS. Establishes the Hale Kokua Program, within the Department of Human Services to incentivize homeowners statewide to set aside dwelling units for rental by families or individuals classified as employed but homeless. Appropriates funds. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)	HMS, WAM
<u>SB 2541</u> (SSCR2006) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO ELDERLY HOUSING. Appropriates funds for the redevelopment, design, and construction of the Hawaii public housing authority administrative offices on School street and the creation of an elderly-only housing complex.	HMS, WAM
<u>SB 2544, SD1</u> (SSCR2007) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO THE HAWAII PUBLIC HOUSING AUTHORITY'S ADMINISTRATION OF THE FEDERAL HOUSING CHOICE VOUCHER PROGRAM. Allows only original household members to retain a federal housing choice voucher. Requires vouchers to be returned to the Hawaii public housing authority when all original members are no longer in the household. Allows minors who survive the original head or co-head of the household and were added to the household to retain the voucher until the last of the minors reaches the age of twenty-one. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)	HMS, WAM
<u>SB 2545, SD1</u> (SSCR2010) <u>Status &</u> Testimony	RELATING TO UNIVERSAL CHILDREN'S SAVINGS ACCOUNTS. Creates a Universal Children's Savings Account Program under the Department of Budget and Finance to enable families to establish savings accounts for their children and assist children with purchasing a home or starting a business. Establishes and appropriates funds into the Universal Children's Savings Account Trust Fund. (SD1)	HMS, WAM
