Gives preference to moneys deposited in the agricultural development and food security special fund from the environmental response, energy, and food security tax for the acquisition of real property for agricultural production. (SD1)	AGL/ENE, WAM
<u>SB 2454, SD1</u> (SSCR2204) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO AGRICULTURE. Establishes a task force to determine whether a state- established regulatory regime should be established to address agricultural use of genetically modified organisms. (SD1)	AGL/HRE/JDL, WAM
<u>SB 2970, SD1</u> (<u>SSCR2317)</u> <u>Status &</u> <u>Testimony</u>	RELATING TO THE ISSUANCE OF SPECIAL PURPOSE REVENUE BONDS TO ASSIST BIOTORK HAWAII, LLC. Authorizes the issuance of special purpose revenue bonds to assist Biotork Hawaii, LLC with the planning, permitting, design, construction, equipping, and operation of a facility to convert agricultural crops and byproducts to biofuels and various feed. Effective July 1, 2050. (SD1)	AGL/ENE, WAM
<u>SB 2222, SD1</u> (SSCR2386) <u>Status &</u> <u>Testimony</u>	RELATING TO FLAVORED TOBACCO PRODUCTS. Prohibits the sale, offering for sale, or distribution of any flavored tobacco product, including menthol products, within the State beginning on January 1, 2015. (SD1)	CPN/JDL, WAM
<u>SB 2235, SD1</u> (SSCR2220) <u>Status &</u> <u>Testimony</u>	RELATING TO EDUCATION. Requires children to undergo a physical examination prior to attending seventh grade beginning with the 2015-2016 school year. Makes an appropriation to the department of education. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)	EDU/HTH, WAM



SB 2236, SD1 (SSCR2164) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO EARLY LEARNING. Authorizes the executive office on early learning to enter into agreements with the department of education and charter schools for use of available classrooms as public preschool classrooms. Requires the executive office on early learning to contract with no less than five charter schools for the use of available classrooms for public preschool classrooms through June 30, 2019. Makes an appropriation. (SD1)	EDU, WAM
SB 2421, SD1 (SSCR2165) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION. Establishes an interagency working group consisting of the chair of the senate committee on education, chair of the house of representatives committee on education, superintendent of education and comptroller, or their designees, and any other relevant parties. Establishes an interagency working group consisting of the chair of the senate committee on education, chair of the house of representatives committee on education, superintendent of education and director of health, or their designees, and any other relevant parties. Tasks both interagency working groups with discussing various issues relating to Act 51, Session Laws of Hawaii 2004. Appropriates funds to the department of accounting and general services for additional positions on the islands of Maui, Hawaii, and Kauai. Appropriates funds to the department of education to establish the interagency working groups and for two full-time equivalent (2.0 FTE) positions. (SD1)	EDU, WAM
<u>SB 2422, SD1</u> (SSCR2219) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO EDUCATION. Allows department of education employees and agents to volunteer to administer epinephrine to a student in anaphylactic shock. Requires proper instruction and training to every employee or agent who volunteers to administer glucagon or epinephrine by a qualified health care professional overseen by the department of health. Requires a student's parent or guardian to provide the department of education with written authorization for epinephrine and to supply auto-injectable epinephrine supplies to administer the epinephrine. Makes an appropriation for required instruction, training, and related expenses. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)	EDU/HTH, WAM
<u>SB 2768, SD1</u> (SSCR2311) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO KINDERGARTEN. Makes kindergarten mandatory for a child who will be at least five years of age on July 31 of the school year. Requires the department of education, in collaboration with the executive office on early learning, to develop a statewide kindergarten readiness program. Establishes an individualized kindergarten readiness assessment system. Makes an appropriation to the department of education. (SD1)	EDU, WAM
<u>SB 2399, SD1</u> (SSCR2261) <u>Status &</u> Testimony	RELATING TO ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT. Creates a geriatric research and technology park under the high technology development corporation. Designates certain properties to be included in the park. (SD1)	EGH/HMS, WAM



<u>SB 2436, SD1</u> (SSCR2259) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO COMMUNITY PLANNING. Establishes the transit-oriented development advisory committee to make recommendations about sustainable development projects close to transit. (SD1)	EGH/TIA/PSM, WAM
SB 2437, SD1 (SSCR2260) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO TRANSIT. Requires all state agencies within one-half mile of proposed rail stations to enter into memoranda of understanding with each other and convene working groups that include representatives of the Honolulu authority for rapid transportation. Requires the working groups to submit annual reports to the legislature. (SD1)	EGH/TIA/PSM, WAM
<u>SB 2776, SD1</u> (SSCR2262) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT. Requires the board of directors of the high technology development corporation to create a film and media park. Designates certain properties to be included in the park. (SD1)	EGH, WAM
<u>SB 3027, SD1</u> (SSCR2384) <u>Status &</u> Testimony	RELATING TO ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT. Allows the energy resources coordinator and governor to designate areas as energy zones. Provides a state business tax credit to qualifying businesses in energy zones. Takes effect 7/1/2050. (SD1)	EGH/ENE, WAM
<u>SB 3054, SD1</u> (SSCR2253) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT. Requires the board of directors of the high technology development corporation to create a public safety technology park. Designates certain properties to be included in the park. (SD1)	EGH/PSM, WAM
<u>SB 3066, SD1</u> (SSCR2263) <u>Status &</u> Testimony	RELATING TO THE PUBLIC-PRIVATE FINANCE INITIATIVE. Establishes the public-private finance initiative (PPIA). Requires the PPIA to initiate a pilot project. Appropriates funds for the PPIA. Repeals on 07/01/2018. (SD1)	EGH/WTL, WAM
<u>SB 3082, SD1</u> (SSCR2258) <u>Status &</u> Testimony	RELATING TO TAXATION. Establishes an income tax credit for taxpayers who incur certain expenses for manufacturing products in Hawaii. Takes effect 7/1/2050. Repeals 1/1/2023. (SD1)	EGH, WAM
SB 2196, SD1 (SSCR2216) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO ENERGY. Re-establishes the energy systems development special fund, which was repealed on June 30, 2013. Increases the amount of the environmental response, energy, and food security tax to be deposited into the environmental response revolving fund, energy security special fund, and agricultural development and food security special fund. Extends the repeal of various allocations of the environmental response, energy, and food security tax from June 30, 2015, to June 30, 2030. (SD1)	ENE/AGL, WAM



<u>SB 2702, SD1</u>

(SSCR2340) Status & Testimony RELATING TO SPECIAL PURPOSE REVENUE BONDS TO ASSIST SEAWATER AIR CONDITIONING PROJECTS ON OAHU. Extends the authorization of the issuance of special purpose revenue bonds to Honolulu Seawater Air Conditioning, LLC, for the purpose of design and construction of a seawater air conditioning district cooling system in downtown Honolulu, for an additional five years. Effective June 29, 2014. (SD1)
