HB 2213, HD1 (SSCR2957) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO A WEST MAUI HOSPITAL. Authorizes the issuance of special purpose revenue bonds to assist West Maui Hospital and Medical Center Foundation, Inc. in establishing a hospital in west Maui. Effective July 1, 2050. (HB2213 HD1)	HTH, WAM
HB 2304, HD2, SD1 (SSCR2909) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO THE NEUROTRAUMA ADVISORY BOARD. To facilitate meeting quorum requirements, reduces Neurotrauma Advisory Board membership from twenty-one to eleven members while maintaining representation of all existing parties. Clarifies quorum and voting requirements and allows the Director of Health to add members from state and county who work in neurotrauma. (SD1)	HTH, WAM
HB 1652, HD1, SD1 (SSCR2868) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO HIGHER EDUCATION. Establishes a five-year pilot project at the Daniel K. Inouye college of pharmacy at the University of Hawaii at Hilo that ensures the financial self-sufficiency of the college. Establishes a special fund for the college of pharmacy. Appropriates moneys from the special fund. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)	HRE, WAM
<u>HB 1654, HD1</u> (SSCR2965) <u>Status &amp;</u> <u>Testimony</u>	RELATING TO HIGHER EDUCATION. Establishes the Campus Facility Board to address repairs and maintenance at the University of Hawaii. Effective July 1, 2525. (HB1654 HD1)	HRE, WAM
<u>HB 1996, HD1</u> (SSCR2870) <u>Status &amp;</u> <u>Testimony</u>	RELATING TO THE MAUI FOOD INNOVATION CENTER. Authorizes the issuance of general obligation bonds for the completion of the Maui Food Innovation Center at the University of Hawaii Maui College. Effective July 1, 2525. (HB1996 HD1)	HRE, WAM



HB 866, HD2, SD1 (SSCR2203) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO SEWER SYSTEMS SERVICING ON HAWAIIAN HOME LANDS. Clarifies counties' ownership of and responsibility for certain existing sewer systems and facilities servicing Hawaiian Home Lands. Requires the counties to accept dedication or license of and responsibility for certain other sewer systems and facilities servicing Hawaiian Home Lands. Effective July 1, 2020. (SD1)	HWN/PSM, WAM
HB 1635 (SSCR2980) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO THE JUDICIARY. Requires the salary of the administrative director of the courts to be equal to the salary of the administrative director of the State and the salary of the deputy administrative director of the courts to be equal to ninety-five per cent of the salary of the administrative director of the courts. HB 2264 (SSCR2979) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO INVESTMENT AUTHORITY OF THE EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM. Repeals the limitation on the holding period for real estate acquired by the Employees' Retirement System by foreclosure, enforcement of security, or in satisfaction of debts.	JDL, WAM
HB 1564, HD1 (SSCR2946) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO VETERANS. Requires the counties to obtain approval from the office of veterans' services prior to any action that may impact the State's obligation to establish and maintain veterans cemeteries. Effective July 1, 2030. (HB1564 HD1)	PSM, WAM
HB 1771, HD2 (SSCR2947) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO CIVIL AIR PATROL. Appropriates funds for Fiscal Year 2014-2015 to support operational mission readiness activities of the Hawaii Wing of the Civil Air Patrol, including facilities maintenance and capital improvements not funded by the National Civil Air Patrol. Effective July 1, 2030. (HB1771 HD2)	PSM, WAM
HB 1868 (SSCR2975) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO EMERGENCY SHELTERS. Authorizes the issuance of general obligation bonds to fund the retrofitting of public school buildings so they can also be used as emergency shelters.	PSM/EDU, WAM
HB 2073, HD1 (SSCR2949) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO MEMORIALS. Appropriates funds for the planning, design, and construction of a Hawaii Gulf War Memorial to be located at the Hawaii State Veterans Cemetery in Kaneohe, on the island of Oahu, and replicas of the memorial to be located at state veterans' cemeteries statewide. Effective July 1, 2050. (HB2073 HD1)	PSM, WAM
HB 2150, HD1 (SSCR2950) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO THE PACIFIC INTERNATIONAL SPACE CENTER FOR EXPLORATION SYSTEMS' PLANETARY SUSTAINABILITY TECHNOLOGIES INITIATIVE. Appropriates funds to support planetary sustainability technology demonstrations and university-based competitions. Effective January 20, 2050. (HB2150 HD1)	PSM, WAM



HB 2363, HD2, SD1 (SSCR2930) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY. Provides systematic reentry programming for nonviolent, low- risk drug offenders by establishing a reentry pilot project for nonviolent, low-risk drug offenders. Effective July 1, 2020, and repealed on June 30, 2016. (SD1)	PSM, WAM
HB 2051, HD1, SD1 (SSCR2896) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO PUBLIC WORKS OF ART. Amends the criteria for the works of art to be commissioned to honor the late U.S. Senator Daniel K. Inouye and the late U.S. Representative Patsy T. Mink pursuant to Act 281, SLH 2013. Amends the appropriation to a blank amount for each year of the 2013-2015 fiscal biennium. Amends the expending agency. Effective July 1, 2050. (SD1)	TEC, WAM
HB 2169, HD1 (SSCR2972) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO TOURISM STIMULUS INCENTIVES. Provides qualified employers a non-refundable income tax credit of a percentage of wages paid to qualified employees for a period after completion of hotel and resort construction or renovation. Provides a general excise tax and a use tax exemption for certain hotel and resort construction or renovation. Effective July 1, 2030. (HB2169 HD1)	TSM, WAM
