

SIXTH DAY

Monday, January 27, 2014

The House of Representatives of the Twenty-Seventh Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2014, convened at 12:06 o'clock p.m., with Vice Speaker Mizuno presiding.

The invocation was delivered by Mr. Chris Manabat of Representative Rida Cabanilla's office, after which the Roll was called showing all Members present with the exception of Representatives Carroll, Fale, McDermott, Takai and Ward, who were excused.

By unanimous consent, reading and approval of the Journal of the House of Representatives of the Fifth Day was deferred.

At 12:11 o'clock p.m., the Chair declared a recess subject to the call of the Chair.

The House of Representatives reconvened at 12:23 o'clock p.m.

ORDER OF THE DAY

SUSPENSION OF RULES

On motion by Representative Cabanilla, seconded by Representative Fukumoto and carried, the rules were suspended for the purpose of considering certain House Bills for Third Reading by consent calendar. (Representatives Carroll and Takai were excused.)

THIRD READING

Representative Rhoads, for the Committee on Judiciary, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1-14) recommending that H.B. No. 611, as amended in HD 1, pass Third Reading.

Representative Saiki moved that the report of the Committee be adopted, and that H.B. No. 611, HD 1 pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative Cabanilla.

Representative McDermott rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Fale rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Belatti rose in support of the measure and asked that her written remarks be inserted in the Journal, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Belatti's written remarks are as follows:

"I rise in support of House Bill 611, House Draft 1 that makes it unlawful for commercial tanning facilities and operators to allow the use of tanning beds by anyone under the age of 18 with reasonable exclusions for licensed physicians and those who own tanning equipment exclusively for personal, noncommercial use.

"The World Health Organization has classified tanning beds as 'carcinogenic to humans' in the same category as asbestos, tobacco, and other harmful substances. Melanoma, the most deadly form of skin cancer, is the second most common cancer among men and women aged 15-29 years. Tanning before age 35 increases the risk of melanoma by 59 percent. Using a tanning bed increases basal and squamous cell carcinomas by 29 percent and 67 percent respectively. Rates increase even more when tanning beds are used before age 25. Tanning beds are also known to deliver UVA radiation 5-15 times higher than what is delivered by the summer midday sun.

"Because early deterrence is important for the reduction of increased health risks associated with early and potentially long-term use of tanning beds, this is a reasonable measure to protect and promote the public health,

safety and welfare related to tanning with artificial ultraviolet light, especially where minors are concerned."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 611, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO TANNING," passed Third Reading by a vote of 49 ayes, with Representatives Carroll and Takai being excused.

Representative Rhoads, for the Committee on Judiciary, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 2-14) recommending that H.B. No. 1072, as amended in HD 1, pass Third Reading.

On motion by Representative Saiki, seconded by Representative Cabanilla and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 1072, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE BOARD OF REGENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII," passed Third Reading by a vote of 49 ayes, with Representatives Carroll and Takai being excused.

Representative Saiki moved that the report of the Committee be adopted, and that H.B. No. 570 pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative Cabanilla.

Representative Thielen rose to disclose a potential conflict of interest, stating:

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 570, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN

ACT RELATING TO CONTRACTORS," passed Third Reading by a vote of 49 ayes, with Representatives Carroll and Takai being excused.
