Representative Takai, for the Committee on Veterans, Military, & International Affairs, & Culture and the Arts, presented two reports:

(Stand. Com. Rep. No. 906-14) recommending that H.R. No. 19 be adopted; and

Representative Saiki moved that the reports of the Committee be adopted, and that H.R. No. 19; and H.C.R. No. 36 be adopted, seconded by Representative Mizuno.

Representative Ward rose to disclose a potential conflict of interest, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, potential conflict. Mr. Speaker, I was a translator and interpreter in Vietnam," and the Chair ruled, "no conflict."

Representative Ward continued to speak in support of both measures, stating:

"And thank you for serving. I think there are six of us here. Mr. Speaker, I rise in strong support. Not only because we in the Army, the Marines, and those who were on the ground are covered by this particular presumption of exposure to Agent Orange, but our brothers and sisters who were out to sea or in the air are not covered.

"Basically what these resolutions say is, hey don't forget about those others who served in Vietnam. Even though they may not have directly been there, let us presume, like everybody else, that they have been exposed to this, because there's been a high incidence of a number of cancers.

"So, Mr. Speaker, I think this is the best thing to do for our veterans, and I know there are other issues that have come up with the Middle Eastern war veterans, Afghanistan, Iraq, *et cetera*, but this is the first step forward in encouraging our delegation to get the presumption back for those who were in the Air Force and those who were on the blue water oceans as Navy. Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative McKelvey rose to speak in support of both measures, stating:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. In strong support. Just a few comments. These resolutions are not only important for the reasons stated by the previous speaker, but in my discussion, this has become a teaching moment to many people of the younger generation who don't know what Agent Orange is.

"I had the chance to talk to some young people, I brought up Orange Crush, and they go, 'What's that, a soda?' And I go, 'no, Agent Orange,' and kind of described Agent Orange and what it did, alluded to the 60 Minutes report that many will remember, talked about the mixing of the chemicals with just white t-shirts on. They had no idea about it, Mr. Speaker. About the ramifications, about what happened, and especially how our service men and women were exposed to this toxic agent.

"So, Mr. Speaker, these resolutions are important not only for the veterans, but this is important to educate a new generation on what Agent Orange in Vietnam was all about. Thank you."
