EEP, CPC HB1541 Clarifies that the eligible customer-generators may contract with a licensed electrician to install net energy meters at the customergenerator's own expense. RELATING TO HABITUAL PROPERTY CRIME. HB1542 PBS, JUD Amends the sentencing options for habitual property crime by requiring that the offender serve the entire one-year term of imprisonment imposed as a condition of probation. RELATING TO NET ENERGY METERING. EEP, CPC HB1543 Requires credits for excess electricity that remain unused after each 12-month reconciliation period to be carried over to the next 12-month period. Requires the electric utility to make available to the eligible customer-generator the option of receiving compensation in lieu of credit for excess kilowatt-hours, at a rate to be determined by the PUC.
