HB2371 RELATING TO TAXATION. HUS, FIN (1) Increases the amount and threshold of the refundable food/excise tax credit. (2) Increases the amount and threshold of the income tax credit for low-income household renters. (3) Reduces the tax liability for low-income taxpayers by creating a tax credit that will eliminate a taxpayer's income tax liability if their federal adjusted gross income falls below federal poverty guidelines. Reduces a taxpayer's income tax liability by 50% if the taxpayer's federal adjusted gross income falls between 100-125% of federal poverty guidelines. (4) Establishes a state earned income tax credit. RELATING TO THE RATE OF INTEREST APPLICABLE TO FIN HB2372 UNDERPAYMENTS AND NONPAYMENTS OF TAX. Lowers the current interest rate payable by taxpayers on underpayments or nonpayments of tax from the rate of two-thirds of one per cent for each month or fraction thereof to the rate of one-third of one per cent for each month or fraction thereof. RELATING TO VIOLATION OF PRIVACY. JUD HB2373 Broadens the offense of violation of privacy in the first degree to include distributing, where there has been an agreement or understanding that the image shall remain private, images of the intimate body parts of another with intent to cause serious emotional distress. RELATING TO PUBLIC SCHOOL HEALTH CURRICULUM **EDN** HB2374 OPT-OUT POLICY. Codifies opt-out provisions for parents and legal guardians who choose to exclude their children from a specific lesson or activity involving standards-based health curriculum. Requires that an alternative standards-based health curriculum be developed and made available for opt-out students. RELATING TO CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS FOR HB2375 THE BENEFIT OF THE THIRTY-THIRD. THIRTY-FOURTH. AND THIRTY-FIFTH REPRESENTATIVE DISTRICTS. Appropriates funds for capital improvement projects for schools in the 33rd, 34th, and 35th representative districts. Effective July 1, 2014. RELATING TO LAND TRANSFER. HB2376 HED, WAL

Transfers land in Kapolei from UH to DLNR.

HB2377 RELATING TO ENERGY. EEP, CPC, FIN

Requires the energy resources coordinator to develop policy guidelines for the PUC. Requires the PUC to document that it follows the guidelines. Requires a report.

HB2378 RELATING TO TRAINING. LMG. FIN

Requires all members of boards and commissions to complete training in ethics, public agency meetings, and information practices within six months of each member's confirmation to the board or commission by the Senate. Establishes a public agency meetings and information practices training course to be administered by the office of information practices. Requires an additional ethics training course to be provided in July of each year.

HB2379 RELATING TO AQUARIUM FISH. WAL/OMH

Requires that no more than 100 aquarium fish permits be issued statewide, and no more than 25 permits be issued in any one county. Requires permit holders to complete daily catch reports. Authorizes DLNR to establish a statewide limited entry program and rules for aquarium fish collectors.

HB2380 RELATING TO SHARK AND RAY PROTECTION. OMH, JUD

Creates administrative penalties for any person who knowingly captures, harms, or kills sharks and rays within state marine waters.

Requires employers to provide a minimum amount of paid sick leave to employees to be used to care for themselves or a family member who is ill or needs medical care.

Requires that an internet web address be included on a meeting notice for instructions on submitting testimony for a meeting; allows boards and commissions to provide notice of a meeting by first class mail or electronic means, including electronic mail and text messaging; requires boards and commissions to provide instructions and contact information for persons to request to be included on the list for notification of meetings to be sent via postal mail or electronic means; and specifies that any person who fails to properly send meeting notices by postal mail or electronic means or fails to send meeting notices in a timely manner shall be subject to penalties.

CPC, JUD Requires an insurer in a first party insurance claim to pay the claimant a fair amount within thirty days of a demand for payment of insurance benefits. Clarifies that all or a portion of the benefits payable by reason of the death of the member of the employees' retirement system or former employee of the State or counties shall be payable to the alternate beneficiary designated under a qualified domestic relations order. Allows the court to issue a qualified domestic relations order for support for purposes of designating an alternate beneficiary to receive retirement benefits under the employees' retirement system in connection with and in addition to a divorce decree. RELATING TO TAXATION. FIN HB2405 Changes income tax brackets and rates after 12/31/2013. Provides for taxation of capital gains as ordinary income. HB2406 RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLE TIRES. EEP, TRN, FIN Imposes a surcharge of \$1 per tire on any tire retailer or wholesaler who installs a replacement tire in the State after September 30, 2014. Repeals on 7/1/2019. RELATING TO THE ISSUANCE OF SPECIAL PURPOSE HB2407 EEP, FIN REVENUE BONDS TO ASSIST TIRE SHREDDING OR RECYCLING BUSINESSES. Authorizes the issuance of special purpose revenue bonds to assist individuals or companies engaged in the business of

shredding or recycling tires.

FIN Makes it a disorderly conduct offense to lie down at a bus stop shelter or structure in a manner that interferes with use of or access to the bus stop. Establishes a fine of \$50 for a violation. Effective 7/1/14. HB2410 RELATING TO EDUCATION. EDN, FIN Requires the Board of Education to develop and the Department of Education to implement a pilot program to assist students in achieving annual goals under the Common Core State Standards. Requires the Board of Education to provide web-based data and information aimed at improving student outcomes. Effective July 1, 2014. HB2411 RELATING TO TELEHEALTH. HLT, CPC Requires reimbursement for services provided through telehealth to be equivalent to reimbursement for the same services provided via face-to-face contact between a health care provider and a patient. Clarifies that a health care provider of telehealth includes primary care providers, mental health providers, and oral health providers such as physicians and osteopathic physicians, advanced practice registered nurses, psychologists, and dentists. Amends references to "telemedicine" in the Hawaii Revised Statutes to "telehealth" for consistency. HB2412 RELATING TO ENVIRONMENTAL COURTS. EEP, JUD, FIN Establishes environmental courts as divisions within the circuit courts to hear all proceedings arising from environmental laws. Requires the Judiciary to report to the Legislature on the total number of environment-related cases filed in the last five years. RELATING TO LABOR. HB2413 LAB, JUD, FIN Applies provisions relating to prevailing wages for public construction work to public-private partnerships. RELATING TO CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS FOR HB2414 FIN THE BENEFIT OF THE ELEVENTH REPRESENTATIVE DISTRICT. Appropriates funds for capital improvement projects for the benefit of the 11th representative district. Effective July 1, 2014.

REFERRAL HB2415 RELATING TO SOCIAL MEDIA. LAB, EDN, JUD Prohibits employers and schools from requiring or requesting employees, potential employees, students, and potential students to grant access to social networking site account usernames and passwords. RELATING TO PAID SICK LEAVE. HB2416 LAB, FIN Requires private employers to provide their service workers with paid sick leave. PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO THE HAWAII HB2417 JUD, FIN CONSTITUTION TO LIMIT THE TERMS OF MEMBERS OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES. Proposes a constitutional amendment to limit the terms of members of the house of representatives elected in the general election of 2016 or thereafter to five consecutive full terms. TRN, CPC, FIN HB2420 Authorizes for testing purposes the operation of autonomous vehicles in the State of Hawaii. Requires Department of Transportation to establish an application and approval process and report annually to the legislature. Makes an appropriation. TRN, JUD, FIN HB2421 RELATING TO UNMANNED AIRCRAFT SYSTEMS. Requires individual consent or a search warrant to track an individual through the use of unmanned aircraft systems. Prohibits the repurposing of data without a search warrant. Prohibits the carrying of firearms aboard unmanned aircraft systems. Prohibits the causing of a nuisance from the operation of unmanned aircraft systems and model aircrafts. Requires the police departments to implement guidelines of the International Association of Chiefs of Police Aviation Committee.

Requires the Hawaii Tourism Authority's annual report to include expenditures with descriptions and evaluations of programs funded, and recommendations.
