### Grant-In-Aid Application Prince David Kawananakoa Middle School January 2015

- I. Background and Summary
  - 1. Applicant's Background

The Kawananakoa Band Booster Club was founded in 1996 to support the needs of the Kawananakoa Middle School Band. The organization provides financial and logistic support for the program. The booster club supports concerts, camps, festivals, clinics, student leadership training, and basic program needs.

Prince David Kawananakoa Middle School was founded in 1927. The campus and adjoining park was a gift from the Kawananakoa Family to the community. The school serves 840 students in grades 6-8 from the neighborhoods of Nu'uanu, Pauoa, Liliha, Pacific Heights, and Punchbowl.

The school has been recognized as a National Blue Ribbon School, has received numerous awards for academic excellence, and has also been recognized as an Arts Excellence School.

Beginning in 2009, various members of the school community convened to discuss school community needs, including facilities, and culture of the school. A Campus Rejuvination Committee was formed with parents, teachers, administrators, area legislators, alumni, and community members. Through a series of community meetings, we were able to come to consensus on the priorities for the school. The top priority was to renovate or replace the existing auditorium, which was built in the 1920s through the vision of Abigail Kawananakoa. Through legislative funding, the Kawananakoa Auditorium will go through extensive renovations starting in February 2015. The renovation will reconfigure the interior of the building to feature a 640 seat concert hall and a 100 seat black box theatre.

2. Goals and Objectives

Our vision is to properly equip the Kawananakoa Auditorium with the ability to host other musical performances by Kawananakoa groups and groups from the greater community. This would allow us to host school-level and community events including:

Kawananakoa Band and Orchestra Performances

- Punchbowl Band Festival
- Oahu Band Directors Association Parade of Bands
- Oahu Band Directors Association Honor Bands
- Hawaii Music Educators Association Conference
- Other schools' musical performances
- Clinics and workshops featuring professional musicians from Hawaii, the US Mainland and abroad

To be able to host a multitude of community events, the facility will need to have it's own house set of music stands, large percussion instruments, and a piano. This would allow for concurrent use of the auditorium for a rehearsal or performance and the music building for instruction. This is not currently possible because the school does not have enough equipment to outfit both facilities at the same time.

Providing the large instruments and music stands will make the building more usable by our school and other groups. This increased usability reduces cost for performers who might otherwise need to transport their own instruments and equipment to the facility. It also reduces the wear and tear on the instruments at Kawananakoa and other school users who might otherwise transport their own instruments there.

There are many times during the year when both the auditorium and the music building are needed at the same time. This allows for honor band rehearsals with the Punchbowl Festival (Kawananakoa, Stevenson, and Central Middle Schools), with the Oahu Band Directors Association (island-wide representation), and to host outside performing groups who wish to perform at the school during the school day while classes are being conducted in the music building.

Being able to host outside groups would also help to generate funds for the school through use of facilities fees, which would in turn help to fund the upkeep of the building, and address any undue wear and tear on the school's instruments.

#### 3. Public Purpose and Need to be Served

The vision of Princess Abigail Kawananakoa was for the Auditorium to be a cultural hub for the community. The current community vision is to honor the Princess' vision and have the facility become one that serves the greater community. Princess Kawananakoa and David Kawananakoa, who have been involved in the auditorium renovation project and the overall scope of the campus rejuvenation projects, have also expressed the same sentiments.

Upon the completion of the renovations in 2016, Kawananakoa Middle School will be the only public middle school in the state with a large capacity auditorium. The facility can serve as host to other school music programs for their regular concerts, as well as islandwide festivals, clinics, honor groups, and state conferences.

4. Target Population

The primary users of the building will be the performing groups from Kawananakoa Middle School. The school serves 840 students in grades 6-8. Over 300 students are enrolled in Band, Orchestra, and Drama classes. The school serves the neighborhoods of Nu'uanu, Pauoa, Pacific Heights, Liliha, Alewa Heights, and parts of Downtown Honolulu.

The greater vision is to have the facility also usable by other schools and community groups, particularly other schools in the Honolulu District. This would then extend use to thousands of students.

5. Geographic Coverage

The facility would primarily serve Kawananakoa Middle School and other schools in the Honolulu District. The facility could potentially serve groups from around the island of Oahu and abroad.

- II. Service Summary and Options
  - 1. Scope of Work

The school will work to ensure that the facility and the provided equipment is used regularly and well-maintained. In addition to internal school use, the school will work to organize and solicit performances from outside groups including other schools and other performing groups.

2. Timeline

The school will create policies and processes for scheduling facility use specific to this facility. Ideally, all internal scheduling for the next school year should be completed by May. Outside groups may schedule events after May. Maintenance of all equipment will be conducted on a quarterly basis or more frequently if needed. In April of each year, the school will evaluate the overall condition of the facility, equipment, and create plans for major repairs or replacement.

3. Quality Assurance

Musical instruments will be maintained by school personnel or other qualified technicians on a quarterly basis or more frequently if needed. Professional musicians have been consulted on all projected purchases.

4. Measures of Effectiveness

The facility should be host to at least 10 school performances, rehearsals or other events during the academic year that use the equipment purchased.

The facility should be host to at least 6 performances, rehearsals or other events by outside groups during the academic year.

    - i. The school administration is trained to handle use of facilities requests and follows state policies regarding such.
    - ii. School level personnel are trained in instrument handling and repair. The music faculty credentials include degrees in music education and instrument repair. Faculty members have been actively involved in school-level and community performances and have done extensive work handling equipment with the Oahu Band Directors Association, the Punchbowl Band Festival, the local chapter of the American String Teachers Association, and the Hawaii Repertory Theatre.

    - i. Upon completion of the renovation of the auditorium, the facility will include adequate storage for the equipment purchased.

- 1. Proposed Staffing, Qualifications, Supervision and Training
