The House of Representatives of the Twenty-Eighth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2015, convened at 12:10 o'clock p.m., with Vice Speaker Mizuno presiding.

The invocation was delivered by Representative Angus L.K. McKelvey, after which the Roll was called showing all Members present with the exception of Representatives Souki and Ward, who were excused.

By unanimous consent, reading and approval of the Journal of the House of Representatives of the Twenty-Eighth Day was deferred.

Representative Ito, for the Committee on Veterans, Military, & International Affairs, & Culture and the Arts, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 913) recommending that S.B. No. 181, SD 1 pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Education.

On motion by Representative Saiki, seconded by Representative Evans and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and S.B. No. 181, SD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO VETERANS," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Education, with Representatives Creagan, Fukumoto Chang, Hashem, Luke, Souki, Tokioka and Ward being excused.

Representative Kawakami, for the Committee on Economic Development & Business, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 914), recommending that H.R. No. 33 be referred to the Committee on Finance.

On motion by Representative Saiki, seconded by Representative Evans and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and H.R. No. 33, entitled: "HOUSE RESOLUTION REQUESTING A STUDY REGARDING THE NEED TO INCREASE THE DOLLAR THRESHOLD THAT DETERMINES WHETHER A SMALL PURCHASE IS EXEMPT FROM SMALL PURCHASE PROCUREMENT PROCEDURES," was referred to the Committee on Finance, with Representatives Creagan, Fukumoto Chang, Hashem, Luke, Souki, Tokioka and Ward being excused.

Representative Kawakami, for the Committee on Economic Development & Business, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 915), recommending that H.C.R. No. 65 be referred to the Committee on Finance.

On motion by Representative Saiki, seconded by Representative Evans and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and H.C.R. No. 65, entitled: "HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION REQUESTING A STUDY REGARDING THE NEED TO INCREASE THE DOLLAR THRESHOLD THAT DETERMINES WHETHER A SMALL PURCHASE IS EXEMPT FROM SMALL PURCHASE PROCUREMENT PROCEDURES," was referred to the Committee on

Finance, with Representatives Creagan, Fukumoto Chang, Hashem, Luke, Souki, Tokioka and Ward being excused.

Representatives Kawakami and Ito, for the Committee on Economic Development & Business and the Committee on Veterans, Military, & International Affairs, & Culture and the Arts, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 916) recommending that H.R. No. 28 be adopted.

On motion by Representative Saiki, seconded by Representative Evans and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and H.R. No. 28, entitled: "HOUSE RESOLUTION COMMEMORATING THE THIRTIETH ANNIVERSARY OF HAWAII'S SISTER-STATE RELATIONSHIP WITH THE GUANGDONG PROVINCE," was adopted, with Representatives Creagan, Fukumoto Chang, Hashem, Luke, Souki and Ward being excused.

Representative Rhoads, for the Committee on Judiciary, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 917) recommending that H.C.R. No. 53, as amended in HD 1, be adopted.

Representative Saiki moved that the report of the Committee be adopted, and that H.C.R. No. 53, HD 1 be adopted, seconded by Representative Evans.

Representative McKelvey rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I stand in strong support. But just a word of caution. I guess I want to note that when you call a constitutional convention, it can pretty much be opened up to anything. So despite the fact that there is a call for this one issue, people should just be aware that once one is called, anything can go on the table. Thank you."

Representative Ing rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"In support. I need to echo that sentiment. Also, there's the fact that 36 mostly red states have already called for a balanced budget amendment, which could be opened up in the Con-Con if this were to pass, which is why an organization like Common Cause isn't supporting this. Thank you."

Representative San Buenaventura rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"In strong support. This resolution says specifically, limits the authority of the Con-Con to that of this specific topic, and in fact we remove authority if it goes beyond. We had the Attorney General testify for the limiting language, and I believe this addresses the prior Representatives' concerns. Thank you."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H.C.R. No. 53, HD 1, entitled: "HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS TO CONVENE A CONSTITUTIONAL CONVENTION TO PROPOSE A CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT TO OVERTURN THE UNITED STATES SUPREME COURT'S DECISION IN *CITIZENS UNITED V. FEDERAL ELECTION COMMISSION*," was adopted, with Representatives Creagan, Fukumoto Chang, Hashem, Luke, Souki and Ward being excused.
