Wednesday, March 25, 2015

The House of Representatives of the Twenty-Eighth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2015, convened at 12:07 o'clock p.m., with Vice Speaker Mizuno presiding.

The invocation was delivered by Mr. Piper Toyama of Honpa Hongwanji Mission of Hawaii, after which the Roll was called showing all Members present with the exception of Representatives Ing and McKelvey, who were excused.

Representative Thielen rose to speak in opposition to the measure, stating:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I'm standing to speak against Standing Committee Report 1084. This is a bill that would create the Office of the State Inspector General, a new government office with all the costs that would go with it. We frankly don't need to do that because what it's looking at is waste and abuse. We have an auditor, and we have an example of when the Auditor assisted the Legislature in looking at the Bureau of Conveyances and there was a quite lengthy, about a week or so long, proceeding looking into the Bureau of Conveyances and what was going wrong and what was going on.

"We don't need to create a whole new government entity. And I would just say for people that are concerned about the rising costs for our constituents, this carries a price tag that we don't need to do because we have an existing entity that can do this work.

"So expand what is in existence if necessary at much less cost. Use the Auditor with the State Attorney General's assistance where it's necessary.

And then we save taxpayers money and we cut down on waste, fraud and abuse where's it's shown. Thank you."

Representative Tupola rose to speak in opposition to the measure, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, a no vote. I just wanted to support my colleague from Kailua in the same regard as far as waste and already having some entities that can fix this problem. Thank you."

Representative McDermott rose to speak in opposition to the measure, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I've had a change of heart and I am going to vote no on this. Thank you."

Representative McKelvey rose to speak in opposition to the measure, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, please cast a no vote for me. I'd like the words of the speaker of Kailua entered into the record as if they were my own. And I'm very concerned that we're setting up a Star Chamber to go after government workers for inefficiencies, waste and amorphous terms like this. Thank you," and the Chair "so ordered." (By reference only.)

Representative Kobayashi rose to speak in opposition to the measure, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, rising in opposition. I think that the other agency that might overlap with this is the State Ombudsman's Office, which has jurisdiction over all matters, both county and State, excluding certain judiciary and legislative matters."

Representative San Buenaventura rose to speak in support of the measure with reservations, stating:

"With reservations. My brother was Regional Inspector General for the United States Department of Agriculture, so I echo the Representative of Kailua's statements. I also believe it is applicative of the Auditor's position. Thank you."

Representative Fukumoto Chang rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for her, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Ward rose to speak in support of the measure with reservations, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I agree with my colleagues but I had some reservations because of two things. One is, a watchdog always costs money. And number two is, until we have a two-party system, I think this is another watch dog that we're going to have to pay for. Thank you."

Representative Oshiro rose to speak in support of the measure with reservations, stating:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I'll be going with reservations. Concerns that I have are those that were raised by the Chair of the CPC Committee. Also the effective date of July 1, 2015. Thank you."

Representative Rhoads rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, in support. Just briefly, I would say that yes, we do have organizations that are already supposed to take of these problems, but I think it's also pretty clear that they don't. So I think we need to consider taking this further step. *Mahalo*."

Representative Matsumoto rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for her, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Ward rose to respond, stating:

"Clarification of my reservation and why the two-party system was mentioned, Mr. Speaker. It's because of checks and balances, which is

innate in the political process. When there's a super majority on one side, no matter where it is or how it is, whether it's one Republican or it's on the Democrat side, it means there's a lack of accountability. Those of us who are married know that our wives keep us accountable. Those of us who are wives know that our husbands keep us accountable.

"A lot of the checks and balances that are needed are generally just in this office in this position, right here in this Chamber. We keep each other accountable because we're watching what the government is doing. With a super majority, it is more difficult. Therefore we need another watch dog, and we may have to pay for it, as my colleagues have indicated. Thank you."

Representative Pouha rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and S.B.
