Monday, March 30, 2015

The House of Representatives of the Twenty-Eighth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2015, convened at 12:09 o'clock p.m., with Vice Speaker Mizuno presiding.

The invocation was delivered by Ms. Lynn Finnegan of the Hawaii Public Charter Schools Network, after which the Roll was called showing all Members present with the exception of Representatives DeCoite and Lowen, who were excused.

"Mr. Speaker, I rise in strong support of HR 157 and HCR 224: Naming the new Waimanalo Elementary and Intermediate School building in honor of Al Lewis.

"Al Lewis was a strong community leader in Waimanalo town. A grandparent of one of the present students at WEIS, Mr. Lewis was a pillar of the community known by most who call Waimanalo home.

"He was known as 'Big Al' in the Democratic Party and he touched the lives of many by looking out for everyone, from the *keiki* to the *kūpuna* of Waimanalo.

"And so Al will continue to be missed by all those who knew him. Naming the new Waimanalo Elementary and Intermediate school building in Al's name will serve as a reminder of his generous spirit of *Aloha* and his hardworking nature.

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

ANNOUNCEMENTS

Representative Ward: "Mr. Speaker, I am amiss of not having made this announcement last Wednesday or Friday, because we had a Thursday Kuhio Day, and generally we acknowledge, at least this caucus generally acknowledges every year, Prince Jonah Kūhiō Kalanianaʻole.

"Mr. Speaker, without going into the details of which most people know, I want to add a couple of things that maybe people didn't know. That he studied at Oxford Law and Saint Matthew's in California, and was later a Republican member of Congress noted for three things. And this may be a bit new to some of us. Hawaiian Homes, we already know that he was very instrumental in the Organic Act. But Volcanoes National Park was something that Prince Kuhio is known for. And then lastly, for the funding of Pearl Harbor, a significant strategic commitment, almost like the Floor presentation today.

"But probably the one thing that people don't know is that he got a lot of this done because he had all night poker games in Washington, and people came to love him and called him 'Prince Cupid.' Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Matsumoto: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I'd just like to announce that today is our very old Minority Leader's birthday. So we can all wish Beth a very happy birthday."
