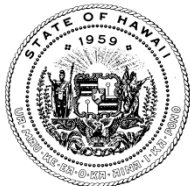

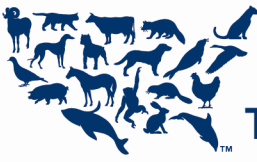

RE: COMMENTS on GM 501; Submitting for consideration and confirmation as the Chairperson of the Department of Agriculture, Gubernatorial Nominee, SCOTT ENRIGHT, for a term to expire 12-31-2018.

The Humane Society of the United States takes no formal position in support or opposition to the confirmation of Mr. Enright, however, since our organization advocates for the protection of all animals, including farm animals, we share the below comments and questions of the nominee since we were unable to meet with him in person to discuss his position on such issues.

Does Mr. Enright believe that counties should be prohibited from enacting their own community specific laws and ordinances related to agriculture? Chair Enright supported [HB849](#) (see page 1) which would have prevented counties from enacting laws or regulations relating to agriculture (farming or ranching). The bill drew significant opposition in the House and failed to be scheduled in the Senate. These “Right to Farm” bills shield industrial agriculture from the democratic process. It would largely prevent voters and local legislators from making reforms that would benefit food safety, animal welfare and protections of our air, land and water. No other industry is given, or deserves, blanket protection from commonsense regulations. Hawaii farmers and ranchers already have statutory ‘right to farm’ protections from frivolous or unfounded lawsuits, as they have had for years.

A number of states have attempted to prohibit the documentation of farm conditions (also known as "ag-gag" anti-whistleblower http://www.nytimes.com/2013/04/10/opinion/eating-with-our-eyes-closed.html?_r=1& legislation). Introduced in state legislatures around the country in the last few years at the behest of the agribusiness industry, these bills (not yet introduced in Hawaii) seek to criminalize whistleblowing by making it illegal to take video or photos on industrialized farms to uncover possible abuse and environmental and food safety problems. In addition to animal welfare concerns, the bills block exposure of food safety threats, unsafe working conditions and environmental problems at industrial agricultural operations. What is Mr. Enright’s position on such legislation?

In addition, some states have sought to weaken protections for farm animals raised for food. **Does Mr. Enright believe that farm animals deserve the same/equal protections as pet animals?**

What is Mr. Enright’s position on confined animal feeding operations (CAFO’s) such as battery cage operations and the use of veal and gestation crates? These intensive farming systems prevent animals from engaging in natural behaviors such as standing up, turning around and extending their limbs and wings, and, due to the number of animals and intensely confined conditions, often have significant negative environmental impacts. While these practices are not in widespread use in Hawaii, compared to other states, would Mr. Enright support or oppose the further development of such practices in Hawaii?

What is Mr. Enright’s response to the claims in this petition with 300+ signatures **LATE**

is “pro animal cruelty” is a strong allegation and he should be given an opportunity to respond to such
allegations.

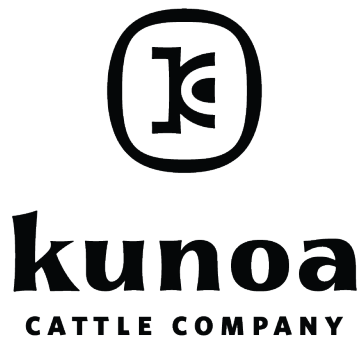
What is Mr. Enright’s position on the state animal quarantine facility and the current level of care provided to animals? Hawaii News Now recently ran a piece on the ongoing concerns at the state quarantine station, which is overseen by the DOA, see:

Furthermore, in October of last year we petitioned the Board of Agriculture to prohibit the issuance of permits for dangerous wild animal acts (such as the use of elephants, lions, tiger and bears at Aloha Stadium and in traveling circuses). As the Chair of the Board of Agriculture, Mr. Enright has postponed decision making on this matter for eight (8) months (it is *tentatively* scheduled to be considered at the May Board of Agriculture meeting). The Attorney General’s office confirmed that the petition request was within the scope and authority of the Board of Agriculture, and not a matter that must be addressed via the legislature, however, it appears that Mr. Enright’s decision to defer the matter was because a similar bill was introduced in the legislature in January, therefore passing this decision off to the legislature. Does Mr. Enright feel that the Board of Agriculture should not make this decision?

Regarding the appointment of Phyllis Shimabukuro as his Deputy Chair:

What is Mr Enright and Mrs. Shimabukuro’s response to her business, Mikilua Poultry Farm, being issued a warning letter by the US Food and Drug Administration in 2011 for multiple “**significant violations**” per the below. How did she correct the problems and how would she advise other egg or food producers to prevent similar violations?
