The Administration of the Office of Hawaiian Affairs (OHA) will recommend to the Board of Trustees a position of **SUPPORT** for GM833, which would confirm OHA Trustee Carmen Hulu Lindsey as the OHA representative on the Kaho‘olawe Island Reserve Commission (KIRC).

Trustee Lindsey is a highly appropriate selection to be OHA’s representative on KIRC. She has an extensive background in Hawaiian culture and cultural expression, as has been reflected by numerous awards and recognitions including the Nā Mahana Award of Excellence and the Central Maui Hawaiian Civic Club’s Kupa Maka‘āinana Award, as well as through her ongoing service as a board member of the Hālau Nā Lei Kaumaka o Uka. She also has a depth of experience in public service and the Native Hawaiian political movement, as demonstrated by her service in the Executive Office of the late Governor John A. Burns, in former Maui Mayor Elmer F. Cravalho’s administration, as well as through her membership in the Ahahui Ka‘ahumanu for nearly two decades, among numerous other activities. OHA accordingly believes that Trustee Lindsey’s background in and demonstrated commitment to the Native Hawaiian community and culture will serve her well as a member of KIRC.

Therefore, OHA urges the Committee to **PASS** GM833. Mahalo for the opportunity to testify.
