Chair Gilbert S.C. Keith-Agaran and Members of the Committee:

Thank you for the opportunity to testify on the proposed statutory revision bill. Senate Bill No. 1156 is submitted pursuant to chapter 23G of the Hawaii Revised Statutes. We are in support of this measure. However, we would like to change our amendment of section 712-1209.6(1), HRS, in section 29 of the measure. Upon further review of the amendment to section 712-1209.6, HRS, and after consulting with the Department of the Attorney General, we believe that a more precise reference would be to title 22 United States Code section 7102(9)(A), not section 7102(14). Although section 7102(13), as cited in the present section 712-1209.6, HRS, was renumbered to 7102(14), as indicated in our revision bill memorandum, section 7102(9) defines "Severe forms of trafficking in persons" and is more on point with the contents of section 712-1209.6, HRS. The Department of the Attorney General is in support of this amendment. The amendment to subsection (1)(b) would read:

"(b) A severe form of trafficking in persons as defined in title 22 United States Code section [~~7102(13)-~~] 7102(9)(A)."

All amendments proposed are of a technical nature and correct errors, omissions or obsolete law. As is the case each year, the revision bill was reviewed by the Office of the Attorney General. A copy of a memorandum explaining why each amendment was proposed was previously submitted to the Chair.
