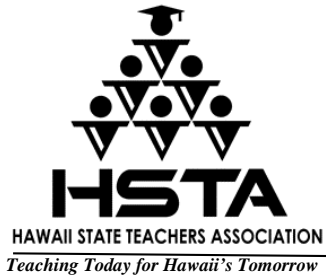
The Department of Education offers the following comments on SCR 094.

Section 302A-1303.5, HRS establishes the Committee on Weights (Committee) and requires that the Committee meet no less than every odd-numbered year to review the weighted student formula. If the Committee deems it necessary, it may recommend a new weighted student formula for adoption by the Board of Education. The Committee is made up of a broad cross section (by geographic location, school size, and school type) of the school community and includes principals, teachers, classified staff, a community member, and is chaired by the Superintendent's designee - a complex area superintendent. The Committee encourages input on the weighted student formula and each of its public meetings includes an opportunity to receive public testimony.

In past years, the Committee has taken into consideration the needs of remote and small schools in developing the weighted student formula. This is just one of many on the list of considerations.

The Committee on Weights IX held its first meeting on March 6, 2015. Several sub-committees were formed to, over the next three months, evaluate various programs for possible inclusion into the funds that are distributed by the weighted student formula. The next Committee meeting is scheduled for June 8, 2015. If this resolution is adopted, copies of SCR 94 will be shared with the not only the Chairperson of the Board, Superintendent, and the Chairperson of the Committee on Weights, but the full Committee on Weights at the next meeting.
