A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CROSSWALK SAFETY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 291C-32, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended to read as follows:

3 "§291C-32 Traffic-control signal legend. (a) Whenever 4 traffic is controlled by traffic-control signals exhibiting 5 different colored lights, or colored lighted arrows, 6 successively one at a time or in combination, only the colors 7 green, red, and yellow shall be used, except for special 8 pedestrian signals carrying a word or symbol legend, and the 9 lights shall indicate and apply to drivers of vehicles and 10 pedestrians as follows:

11 (1) Green indication:

12 (A) Vehicular traffic facing a circular green signal
13 may proceed straight through or turn right or
14 left unless a sign at the place prohibits either
15 such turn. But vehicular traffic, including
16 vehicles turning right or left, shall yield the
17 right-of-way to other vehicles and to pedestrians

1			lawfully within the intersection or an adjacent
2			crosswalk at the time such signal is exhibited.
3		(B)	Vehicular traffic facing a green arrow signal,
4			shown alone or in combination with another
5			indication, may cautiously enter the intersection

9			vehicular traffic shall yield the right-of-way to

1 (B) The driver of a vehicle which is stopped in 2 obedience to a steady red indication may make a 3 right turn but shall yield the right-of-way to 4 pedestrians and other traffic proceeding as 5 directed by the signal at said intersection, 6 except that counties by ordinance may prohibit 7 any such right turn against a steady red indication, which ordinance shall be effective 8 9 when a sign is erected at such intersection 10 giving notice thereof. 11 (C) The driver of a vehicle on a one-way street which 12 intersects another one-way street on which 13 traffic moves to the left shall stop in obedience 14 to a steady red indication but may then make a 15 left turn into said one-way street, but shall 16 yield right-of-way to pedestrians, proceeding as 17 directed by the signal at said intersection 18 except that counties by ordinance may prohibit 19 any such left turn as above described which 20 ordinance shall be effective when a sign is

1 SECTION 2. Section 291C-72, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 3 "(a) The driver of a vehicle shall stop for a pedestrian 4 who is crossing the roadway within a crosswalk when the 5 pedestrian is either: 6 (1) Upon the half of the roadway upon which the vehicle is 7 traveling; or Approaching the vehicle so closely from the opposite, 8 (2) 9 half of the roadway as to be in danger, 10 and shall not proceed until the pedestrian has passed the 11 vehicle and the driver can safely proceed. 12 As used in this section, a pedestrian is crossing the 13 roadway within a crosswalk when any part or extension of the 14 pedestrian, including any part of the pedestrian's body, wheelchair, cane, crutch, or bicycle, is beyond the curb or the 15 16 edges of the traversable roadway within a crosswalk with the 17 intent to proceed." 18 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that 19 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were 20 begun before its effective date.

21 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
