SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE CONVENING OF A FAMILY CAREGIVERS WORKING GROUP TO EXAMINE AND ASSESS LEGISLATION RELATING TO THE ROLE OF CAREGIVERS OF PATIENTS DISCHARGED FROM HOSPITALS.

WHEREAS, many patients who are discharged from the hospital 1 2 require continued care at home; and 3 4 WHEREAS, because of costs and other factors, family 5 caregivers are increasingly called upon to provide such care; 6 and 7 WHEREAS, based on estimates from 2009, there were 247,000 8 family caregivers in Hawaii; and 9 10 WHEREAS, caregiver advocates in Hawaii believe that the 11 12 amount of instruction that family caregivers currently receive from hospitals depends largely on the individual hospital 13 treating the patient; however, there is a need to provide a 14 15 minimum and consistent level of instruction for all caregivers 16 statewide; and 17 18 WHEREAS, hospitals face greater pressure from the federal government and private insurers to avoid the readmission of 19 patients within thirty days of their initial discharge; and 20 21 WHEREAS, hospitals presently provide discharge plans for 22 23 all patients, which may or may not involve family caregivers; 24 and 25 WHEREAS, the hospital members of the Healthcare Association 26 of Hawaii remain concerned about how legislation would affect 27 factors such as liability, cost, and implementation; and 28

1 WHEREAS, S.B. No. 296, introduced during the Regular 2 Session of 2015, includes provisions that seek to address many 3 of these concerns; and 4 WHEREAS, the working group that was created by H.C.R. No. 5 78, H.D. 1, S.D. 1, Regular Session of 2014, was unable to reach 6 7 consensus and unable to submit a written report of its findings 8 and recommendations to the Legislature no later than twenty days 9 prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2015, as 10 directed; and 11 WHEREAS, there must be an even balance between caregiver 12 advocates and hospitals in the membership of the working group; 13 14 and 15 16 WHEREAS, the working group is scheduled to dissolve on 17 June 30, 2016; now, therefore, 18 19 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-eighth 20 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2015, the House of Representatives concurring, that the co-chairs, as 21 identified in this measure, are requested to convene a Family 22 23 Caregivers Working Group to examine and assess issues contained in S.B.
