## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DOMESTIC ABUSE PROTECTIVE ORDERS.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that mutual orders of
- 2 protection are protective orders issued against both parties to
- 3 a dispute. Usually mutual protective orders are issued after
- 4 one of the parties petitions for a protective order. While
- 5 protective orders are intended to protect a victim of abuse from
- 6 imminent threat of abuse or further domestic abuse, mutual
- 7 protective orders can present a variety of problems that may be
- 8 contrary to the purpose of a protective order.
- 9 Mutual protective orders may trivialize the domestic abuse
- 10 and may place blame on the victim rather than hold the abuser
- 11 accountable. Instead, the victim may be stigmatized by the
- 12 mutual protective order.
- 13 The purpose of this Act is to prohibit the court from
- 14 granting mutual protective orders unless separate petitions are
- 15 filed.

## S.B. NO. 2310

1	SECTION 2. Chapter 586, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	"§586- Mutual protective orders. No protective order
5	shall be entered against the plaintiff in the same petition
6	unless:
7	(1) The respondent properly files a separate petition; and
8	(2) The plaintiff has reasonable notice of the filing of
9	the separate petition."
10	SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
11	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
