A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 353-66, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by amending subsection (e) to read as follows:
- 3 Any paroled prisoner retaken and reimprisoned as 4 provided in this chapter shall be confined according to the 5 paroled prisoner's sentence for that portion of the paroled 6 prisoner's term remaining unserved at time of parole, but successive paroles may, in the discretion of the paroling 7 8 authority, be granted to the prisoner during the life and in 9 respect of the sentence. If the paroled prisoner is retaken and 10 reimprisoned for violating a condition of parole but has not:
 - (1) Been charged with a new felony offense or a new misdemeanor offense under chapter 134, chapter 707, or section 709-906;
- 14 (2) Absconded or left the State without permission from15 the paroling authority;

1	(3) Violated conditions applicable to sex offenders, such
2	as registering as a sex offender or conditions related
3	to proximity to specified locations or persons; or
4	(4) Been previously reimprisoned for violating the
5	conditions of parole on the current offense,
6	the paroled prisoner shall be confined for no more than six
7	months or for that portion of the paroled prisoner's term
8	remaining unserved at the time of parole, whichever is shorter,
9	so long as the paroling authority has approved a parole plan as
10	set forth under section 706-670(3) and (4). The minimum term of
11	imprisonment shall be as determined by the court or the paroling
12	authority, as the case may be. The prisoner shall be given
13	credit for time served in custody pending a hearing on
14	revocation of parole as it relates to the six-month parole
15	revocation. No prisoner shall be incarcerated beyond the
16	expiration of the prisoner's maximum terms of imprisonment."
17	SECTION 2. New statutory material is underscored.
18	SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
