A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE NURSING FACILITY SUSTAINABILITY PROGRAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Act 156, Session Laws of Hawaii 2012, as
- 2 amended by section 2 of Act 142, Session Laws of Hawaii 2013, as
- 3 amended by section 1 of Act 124, Session Laws of Hawaii 2014, as
- 4 amended by section 1 of Act 69, Session Laws of Hawaii 2015, is
- 5 amended by amending section 2 as follows:
- 6 1. By amending subsection (c) of § ~4, Hawaii Revised
- 7 Statutes, to read:
- 8 "(c) Revenue from the nursing facility sustainability fee
- 9 shall be used exclusively as follows:
- 10 (1) No less than eighty-eight per cent of the revenue from
- the nursing facility sustainability fee shall be used
- to match federal medicaid funds, with the combined
- total to be used to enhance capitated rates to
- 14 medicaid managed care health plans for the purpose of
- 15 increasing medicaid payments to private nursing
- 16 facilities;

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1	(2) Twelve per cent of the revenue from the nursing

12	facility sustainability fee and federal matching funds to
13	enhance the capitated rates paid to medicaid managed care health
14	plans for the state fiscal year [2015-2016,] 2016-2017,
15	consistent with the following objectives:
16	(1) The rate enhancement shall be used exclusively for
17	increasing reimbursements to private nursing
18	facilities to support the availability of services and
19	to ensure access to care to the medicaid managed care
20	health plan enrollees;

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1	(2)	The rate enhancement shall be made part of the monthly
2		capitated rates by the department to medicaid managed
3		care health plans, which shall provide documentation
4		to the department and the nursing facility trade

8	(3)	The rate enhancement shall be actuarially sound and
9		approved by the federal government for federal fund
10		participation; and
11	(4)	The department shall modify the fee-for-service
12		reimbursement rates of the nursing facilities to
13		recognize the medicaid portion of the nursing facility
14		sustainability fee as an additional cost of serving
15		medicaid patients, and to provide a uniform percentage
16		increase in pre-existing facility-specific rates."

This Act shall take effect on June 29, 2014; 15 provided that: 16 (1) Section 5 shall take effect on July 1, 2014; 17 (2) The amendments made to sections 36-27(a) and 36-30(a), 18 Hawaii Revised Statutes, in sections 3 and 4 of this 19 Act shall not be repealed when sections 36-27 and

36-30, Hawaii Revised Statutes, are reenacted on

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1	June 30, 2015, pursuant to section 34 of Act 79,
2	Session Laws of Hawaii 2009; and
3	(3) The amendments made to sections 36-27(a) and 36-30(a),
4	Hawaii Revised Statutes, in sections 3 and 4 of this
5	Act shall be repealed on December 31, [2016.] 2017."
6	SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the nursing
7	facility sustainability program special fund the sum of
8	\$14,000,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
9	year 2016-2017 for uses consistent with the nursing facility
10	sustainability program special fund.
11	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
12	human services for the purposes of this Act.
13	SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
14	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
15	SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2016;
16	provided that sections 1 and 2 shall take effect on June 29,
17	2016.
