A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO WORKERS' COMPENSATION TREATMENT PLANS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii's current
- 2 system for physicians to submit treatment plans in workers'
- 3 compensation claims is in need of modernization given
- 4 advancements in technology. The legislature further finds that
- 5 allowing treatment plans to be faxed will greatly improve the
- 6 efficiency of Hawaii's workers' compensation system. This first
- 7 step will assist in making the system better while the
- 8 department of labor and industrial relations completes the
- 9 studies of the system that were previously requested by the
- 10 legislature.
- 11 The purpose of this Act is to improve the efficiency of
- 12 Hawaii's workers' compensation system by permitting an option
- 13 for the transmittal of treatment plans via facsimile.
- 14 SECTION 2. Chapter 386, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 16 and to read as follows:
- 17 "§386- Treatment plans. (a) A physician may transmit a
- 18 treatment plan to an employer by mail or facsimile; provided

- 1 that the physician shall send the treatment plan to an address
- 2 or facsimile number provided by the employer.
- 3 (b) Beginning January 1, 2021, an employer shall allow a
- 4 physician to transmit a treatment plan to an employer by mail,
- 5 facsimile, or secure electronic means; provided that the
- 6 physician shall send the treatment plan to an address or
- 7 facsimile number provided by the employer.
- 8 (c) A treatment plan shall be deemed received by an
- 9 employer when the plan is sent by mail or facsimile with
- 10 reasonable evidence showing that the treatment plan was
- 11 received.
- 12 (d) A treatment plan shall be deemed accepted if an
- 13 employer fails to file with the director:
- 14 (1) An objection to the treatment plan;
- 15 (2) Any applicable documentary evidence supporting the
- denial; and
- 17 (3) A copy of the denied treatment plan,
- 18 copying the physician and the injured employee.
- 19 (e) After acceptance of the treatment plan, an employer
- 20 may file an objection to the plan if new documentary evidence
- 21 supporting the denial is received by the employer."

- 2 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
