A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that licensure for the
2	practice of behavior analysis in Hawaii is needed for the
3	public's health, safety, and welfare. Act 199, Session Laws of
4	Hawaii 2015, codified as chapter 465D, Hawaii Revised Statutes,
5	established standards for the licensing of behavior analysts to
6	address the present and critical need to ensure that persons
7	requiring diagnosis and treatment for autism receive the care
8	they need. Act 199 recognized that behavior analysts and the
9	practice of behavior analysis should be subject to regulation
10	and control to protect the public from unqualified practitioners
11	and from unprofessional conduct. The legislature finds that
12	licensure of behavior analysts is necessary for both client
13	protection and access to services.
14	While ensuring the provision of quality services by
15	properly trained providers is of the utmost importance, the
16	State's current credentialed workforce is inadequate to meet
17	present needs. Thus, policies that ensure that a qualified
18	workforce can continue to provide necessary behavior

- 1 interventions while simultaneously facilitating efforts to build
- 2 an adequate workforce of credentialed paraprofessionals and
- 3 licensed professionals to implement behavior plans are
- 4 imperative.
- 5 The purpose of this Act is to ensure that behavioral
- 6 services continue to be available for clients who depend on them
- 7 while facilitating the long-term development of an adequate
- 8 professional and paraprofessional workforce.
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 465D-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 10 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
- 11 "(a) This chapter is not intended to restrict the practice
- 12 of other licensed or credentialed [healthcare] practitioners
- 13 practicing within their own recognized scopes of practice and
- 14 shall not apply to:
- 15 (1) An individual working within the scope of practice or
- duties of another licensed profession that overlaps
- 17 with the practice of behavior analysis; provided that
- the person does not purport to be a behavior analyst;
- 19 (2) An individual who implements or designs applied
- 20 behavior analysis services and possesses board

2		in accordance with the most recent supervisory and
3		ethical requirements adopted by the Behavior Analyst

6	(3)	An individual who directly implements applied behavior
7		analysis services[, is] and
8		(A) Is credentialed as a registered behavior
9		technician by the Behavior Analyst Certification
10	-	Board, and is under the direction of a behavior
11		analyst licensed in this State; or
12		(B) Is a direct support worker who provides autism
13		treatment services pursuant to an individualized
14		education plan on or before January 1, 2019;
15		provided that for purposes of this paragraph, "direct
16		support worker" means a teacher or paraprofessional
17		who directly implements intervention or assessment
18		plans under supervision and does not design
19		intervention or assessment plans;
20	(4)	A family member or legal guardian implementing an
21		applied behavior analysis plan [within the home] and

3	(5)	An individual who engages in the practice of behavior
4		analysis with nonhuman or nonpatient clients or
5		consumers including but not limited to applied animal

7		behavior management;
8	(6)	A matriculated graduate student or postdoctoral fellow
9		whose activities are part of a defined behavior
10		analysis program of study, practicum, or intensive
11		practicum; provided that the student's or fellow's
12		activities or practice is directly supervised by a
13		behavior analyst licensed in this State or an
14		instructor in a Behavior Analyst Certification Board-
15		approved course sequence; or
16	(7)	An individual pursuing experience in behavior analysis
17 .		consistent with the Behavior Analyst Certification
18	į	Board's experience requirements; provided that the
19		experience is supervised by a behavior analyst
20		licensed in this State."

- 1 SECTION 3. The department of education shall submit a
- 2 report to the legislature prior to the convening of the regular
- 3 sessions of 2017 and 2018 on its plans and progress in
- 4 implementing measures to comply with the licensure and
- 5 certification requirements of chapter 465D, Hawaii Revised
- 6 Statutes.
- 7 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 8 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 9 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2016.
