A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CITATIONS FOR MASSAGE THERAPY VIOLATIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 452, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
3	and to read as follows:		
4	"§452- Citation for licensee violations; fines. (a) In		
5	addition to any other remedy available under this chapter, the		
6	department of commerce and consumer affairs may issue a citation		
7	to any person who holds a massage therapist or massage therapy		
8	establishment license issued by the board, or is designated the		
9	principal massage therapist by the massage therapy		
10	establishment, for any of the following violations of this		
11	chapter or the rules adopted pursuant to this chapter and		
12	chapter 91:		
13	(1) Failure of a massage therapy establishment, during all		
14	hours of operation, to conspicuously display a current		
15	massage therapy establishment license and the current		
16	licenses and permits of all persons employed by the		
17	massage therapy establishment who engage in the		
18	practice of massage therapy;		

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1	(2)	railure of a principal massage therapist to ensure
2		that every massage therapist apprentice who engages in
3		the practice of massage therapy at the massage therapy
4		establishment wears a conspicuously placed name tag
5		stating the massage therapist apprentice's name and
6		the word "apprentice" during all hours of operation;
7	(3)	Operation of a massage therapy establishment without
8		the presence of a principal massage therapist or a
9		licensed designee during all hours of operation; or
10	(4)	Failure of a massage therapist or massage therapy
11		establishment to include the respective massage
12		therapist's or massage therapy establishment's current
13		license number in any advertisement pursuant to
14		section 452-23(b).
15	(b)	Each citation:
16	(1)	Shall be in writing and describe the basis of the
17		citation, including the specific statute or rule
18		violated;
19	(2)	May contain an order of abatement and the assessment
20		of a fine in the amount of \$250 for each violation;

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1	<u>(3)</u>	Shall be served on the licensee by personal service;	
2		and	
3	(4)	Shall inform the licensee that the licensee may submit	
4		a written request to the board for a hearing to	
5		contest the citation, within twenty calendar days from	
6		the service of the citation.	
7	<u>(c)</u>	If the licensee timely submits a written request to	
8	the board	for a hearing, the board may designate a hearings	
9	officer to	o conduct the hearing in accordance with chapter 91.	
10	<u>(d)</u>	If the licensee does not timely submit a written	
11	request to	the board for a hearing, the citation shall be deemed	
12	a final order of the board.		
13	<u>(e)</u>	Failure of a licensee to pay any assessed fine within	
14	thirty cal	lendar days, unless the licensee contests the citation,	
15	may result	in further disciplinary action by the board."	
16	SECT	ION 2. Section 452-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
17	amended by	y adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted	
18	and to read as follows:		
19	" <u>"Pri</u>	ncipal massage therapist" means a massage therapist	
20	designated	d by an establishment or an out-call massage service as	
21	the person	n in charge."	

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- 1 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 2 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 3 begun before its effective date.
- 4 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
- 5 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2016.
