A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PHYSICAL EXAMINATIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that school physical
- 2 examinations are currently only conducted upon entry into the
- 3 public school system, usually in kindergarten. The expansion of
- 4 physical examination requirements for public school students
- 5 will help reinforce a culture of wellness and preventative
- 6 health care in the State. Furthermore, for children and
- 7 adolescents who are obese, an additional physical examination.
- 8 visit provides an opportunity for the health care provider to
- 9 assess the possible causes of obesity and develop a plan to
- 10 support family-based lifestyle changes.
- 11 The purpose of this Act is to require the provision of
- 12 written documentation of a physical examination performed within
- 13 twelve months prior to attending seventh grade at a public
- 14 school.
- 15 SECTION 2. Section 302A-1159, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 16 amended to read as follows:
- 17 "§302A-1159 Physical examination required. (a) No child
- 18 shall attend any school for the first time in the State unless

- 1 the child presents to the appropriate school official a report
- 2 from a licensed physician, physician assistant, or advanced
- 3 practice registered nurse of the results of a physical
- 4 examination performed within [a year of] twelve months before
- 5 the date of attendance at school. A child may attend school
- 6 provisionally upon submitting written documentation from a
- 7 licensed physician, physician assistant, advanced practice
- 8 registered nurse, or other authorized representative of the
- 9 department of health stating that the child is in the process of
- 10 undergoing a physical examination. Further documentation
- 11 showing that the required physical examination has been
- 12 completed shall be submitted to the appropriate school official
- 13 no later than three months after the child first attends the
- 14 school.
- (b) Beginning with the 2017-2018 school year, every child
- 16 entering seventh grade shall present to the appropriate school
- 17 official written documentation from a licensed physician,
- 18 physician assistant, or advanced practice registered nurse
- 19 showing completion of a physical examination performed within
- 20 twelve months before the date of attendance. The department
- 21 shall send notification of the physical examination requirement

- 1 to the child's parents or guardians, upon the child's entrance
- 2 into sixth grade, and post the requirement on the department's
- 3 website. By December 31 of each year, the department shall
- 4 provide to the department of health a list of students attending
- 5 seventh grade who have not submitted appropriate written
- 6 documentation, along with directory information as allowed under
- 7 the federal Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act."
- 8 SECTION 3. Chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 9 amended by adding a new section to part II to be appropriately
- 10 designated and to read as follows:
- 11 "§321- Department of education student physical
- 12 examination follow-up assistance and consultations. (a) No
- 13 later than the end of the seventh grade school year, the
- 14 department of health shall contact the parents or quardians of
- 15 students listed pursuant to section 302A-1159(b) and provide
- 16 information to assist those persons in obtaining a physical
- 17 examination for the student pursuant to section 302A-1159(b).
- 18 (b) Subject to the availability of funds, the department
- 19 of health shall also provide follow-up notice to or
- 20 consultations with the parents or quardians of the students
- 21 contacted pursuant to subsection (a) on the benefits of a

- 1 healthy lifestyle and preventative health care and the
- 2 availability of health care coverage under the federal Patient
- 3 Protection and Affordable Care Act or medicaid."
- 4 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 5 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 6 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
